AN ACT CONCERNING MEDICAID COVERAGE FOR ALLERGY PREVENTION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (NEW) (*Effective July 1, 2025*) (a) To the extent permissible
- 2 under federal law, the Commissioner of Social Services shall provide
- 3 Medicaid coverage for allergen introduction dietary supplements for
- 4 infants enrolled in the Medicaid program to help prevent common food
- 5 allergies, including, but not limited to, allergies to peanuts, eggs and
- 6 dairy products.
- 7 (b) The commissioner shall seek any necessary federal approval,
- 8 including, but not limited to, a Medicaid waiver or amendment to the
- 9 Medicaid state plan, to provide such coverage. Not later than September
- 10 1, 2026, the commissioner shall file a report, in accordance with the
- 11 provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes, with the joint
- 12 standing committee of the General Assembly having cognizance of
- 13 matters relating to human services on (1) the number of infants
- 14 provided such supplements, and (2) an estimate of savings that may
- 15 accrue to the state from preventing allergies that may later require

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16 medical intervention.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following
sections:

Section 1	July 1, 2025	New section

Statement of Purpose:

To require Medicaid coverage, to the extent permissible under federal law, for allergen introduction dietary supplements for infants to prevent common food allergies that may later require costly medical intervention.
