## AN ACT CONCERNING REVISIONS TO THE COMPREHENSIVE SCHOOL HEALTH EDUCATION CURRICULUM AND THE AVAILABILITY OF INFORMATION ON THE DANGERS OF VAPING FOR USE BY SCHOOL DISTRICTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 Section 1. (Effective from passage) Not later than January 1, 2020, the
- 2 Department of Education shall include the role of consent in sexual
- 3 relationships in the comprehensive school health education component
- 4 of the Healthy and Balanced Living Curriculum Framework developed
- 5 by the department in 2006.
- Sec. 2. Subsection (d) of section 10-16b of the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July*
- 8 1, 2019):
- 9 (d) The State Board of Education shall make available curriculum
- 10 materials and such other materials as may assist local and regional
- 11 boards of education in developing instructional programs pursuant to
- 12 this section. The State Board of Education, within available
- 13 appropriations and utilizing available resource materials, shall assist
- 14 and encourage local and regional boards of education to include: (1)
- 15 Holocaust and genocide education and awareness; (2) the historical
- 16 events surrounding the Great Famine in Ireland; (3) African-American
- 17 history; (4) Puerto Rican history; (5) Native American history; (6)

personal financial management, including, but not limited to, financial literacy as developed in the plan provided under section 10-16pp; (7) training in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of automatic external defibrillators; (8) labor history and law, including organized labor, the collective bargaining process, existing legal protections in the workplace, the history and economics of free market capitalism and entrepreneurialism, and the role of labor and capitalism in the development of the American and world economies; (9) climate change consistent with the Next Generation Science Standards; (10) topics approved by the state board upon the request of local or regional boards of education as part of the program of instruction offered pursuant to subsection (a) of this section; [and] (11) instruction relating to the Safe Haven Act, sections 17a-57 to 17a-61, inclusive; and (12) instruction relating to the dangers and health consequences of using electronic nicotine delivery systems and vapor products. The Department of Energy and Environmental Protection shall be available to each local and regional board of education for the development of curriculum on climate change as described in this subsection.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
