AN ACT CONCERNING ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 That the general statutes be amended to increase funding to (1) the
- 2 Office of the Attorney General to increase efforts to protect consumers
- 3 from the use of artificial intelligence, (2) the Technology Talent
- 4 Advisory Committee for training initiatives, (3) the Board of Regents for
- 5 Higher Education to expand its community college seminar programs
- 6 for workers offered under section 10a-80 of the general statutes, and (4)
- 7 Regional Education Service Centers for the purpose of providing
- 8 training to school districts regarding the use of artificial intelligence in
- 9 schools.

Statement of Purpose:

To (1) protect the public from harmful unintended consequences of artificial intelligence, (2) train Connecticut's workforce to use artificial intelligence, and (3) allow schools to utilize the benefits of artificial intelligence in a responsible manner.
