AN ACT CONCERNING CONSUMER PROTECTION AND SAFETY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- 1 That the general statutes be amended to (1) eliminate junk fees
- 2 charged in connection with certain consumer transactions, (2) provide
- 3 that neither the state nor any state agency, state contractor or
- 4 municipality shall purchase or use any aerial drone manufactured in the
- 5 People's Republic of China or the Russian Federation, (3) prohibit sales
- 6 of certain information gathered by way of consumer electronics without
- 7 consumers' consent, (4) require manufacturers of consumer goods to
- 8 enable third parties to repair such consumer goods, (5) prohibit price

- gouging at all levels of the supply chain, and (6) require each 9
- municipality to establish and maintain a ".gov" Internet top-level 10
- 11 domain.
