AN ACT CONCERNING CERTAIN SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEMS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. Subsection (g) of section 22a-430 of the 2024 supplement to
the general statutes is repealed and the following is substituted in lieu
thereof (*Effective from passage*):

4 (g) The commissioner shall, by regulation adopted prior to October 1, 5 1977, establish and define categories of discharges that constitute 6 household and small commercial subsurface sewage disposal systems 7 for which the commissioner shall delegate to the Commissioner of 8 Public Health the authority to issue permits or approvals and to hold 9 public hearings in accordance with this section, on and after said date. 10 Not later than July 1, 2025, the commissioner shall amend such 11 regulations to establish and define categories of discharges that 12 constitute small community sewerage systems. [and household and 13 small commercial subsurface sewage disposal systems.] The 14 Commissioner of Public Health shall, pursuant to section 19a-36, 15 establish minimum requirements for small community sewerage 16 systems and household and small commercial subsurface sewage

17 disposal systems and procedures for the issuance of such permits or 18 approvals by the local director of health or a sanitarian registered 19 pursuant to chapter 395. As used in this subsection, small community 20 sewerage systems and household and small commercial disposal 21 systems shall include those subsurface sewage disposal systems with a 22 capacity of ten thousand gallons per day or less. Notwithstanding any 23 provision of the general statutes (1) the regulations adopted by the 24 commissioner pursuant to this subsection that are in effect as of July 1, 25 [2017] 2024, shall apply to household and small commercial subsurface 26 sewage disposal systems with a capacity of [seven thousand five 27 hundred] ten thousand gallons per day or less, and (2) the regulations 28 adopted by the commissioner pursuant to this subsection that are in 29 effect as of July 1, 2025, shall apply to small community sewerage systems, household systems and small commercial subsurface sewerage 30 31 disposal systems with a capacity of ten thousand gallons per day or less. 32 Any permit denied by the Commissioner of Public Health, or a director 33 of health or registered sanitarian shall be subject to hearing and appeal 34 in the manner provided in section 19a-229. Any permit granted by the 35 Commissioner of Public Health, or a director of health or registered 36 sanitarian on or after October 1, 1977, shall be deemed equivalent to a 37 permit issued under subsection (b) of this section.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following
sections:Section 1from passage22a-430(g)

Statement of Purpose:

To specify that certain regulations of the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection in effect as of July 1, 2024, shall apply to household and small commercial subsurface sewage disposal systems with a capacity of ten thousand gallons per day or less and make technical changes.
