AN ACT CONCERNING APPRENTICESHIP REPORTING DATA.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. Section 31-22r of the general statutes is repealed and the
 following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective July 1, 2023*):

3 (a) (1) Each person who registered as an apprentice with the Labor 4 Department before July 1, 2003, and has not completed an 5 apprenticeship as of July 9, 2003, shall pay to the Labor Department a registration fee of twenty-five dollars on or before July 1, 2003, and a 6 7 renewal registration fee of twenty-five dollars on or before July first of 8 each subsequent year until (A) such registration is withdrawn, or (B) 9 such person has completed an apprenticeship and possesses a valid 10 journeyperson card of occupational license, if required.

(2) Each person who initially registers as an apprentice with the Labor
Department on or after July 1, 2003, shall pay to the Labor Department
a registration fee of fifty dollars at the time of registration and an annual
renewal registration fee of fifty dollars until (A) such registration is
withdrawn, or (B) such person has completed an apprenticeship and

possesses a valid journeyperson card of occupational license, ifrequired.

18 (b) Each person sponsoring an apprenticeship program registered 19 with the Labor Department as of July 1, 2003, shall pay to the Labor 20 Department an annual registration fee of sixty dollars for each 21 apprentice participating in such program until the apprentice has 22 completed the apprenticeship and possesses a valid journeyperson card 23 of occupational license, if required, or such program is cancelled by the 24 sponsor or deregistered for cause by the Labor Department in 25 accordance with regulations adopted pursuant to this chapter, 26 whichever is earlier.

27 (c) Each person sponsoring an apprenticeship program registered 28 with the Labor Department as of July 1, 2023, shall annually submit the 29 following information along with such sponsor's annual registration fee: (1) The current minimum completion rate of such sponsor's 30 31 apprenticeship program, (2) the number of registered apprentices 32 currently employed by such sponsor, (3) the number of women apprentices currently employed by such sponsor, (4) the number of 33 34 apprentices who are persons of color currently employed by such 35 sponsor, (5) the number of licensed journeypersons currently employed by such sponsor, (6) the number of such sponsor's registered apprentices 36 37 who have advanced a year in such sponsor's program since the date of 38 the sponsor's last registration, or year to date for new sponsors, (7) the 39 number of apprentices who have separated from such sponsor's 40 program since the date of their last registration, or year to date for new 41 sponsors, (8) the number of apprentices who have completed an apprenticeship program with such sponsor since the date of the 42 43 sponsor's last registration, or year to date for new sponsors, (9) the 44 number of apprentices who have completed such sponsor's program 45 who have since applied with the Department of Consumer Protection to 46 sit for a licensing exam since the date of the sponsor's last registration, 47 or year to date for new sponsors, and (10) the number of apprentices 48 who sat for such licensing exam and who passed such exam and who 49 are now licensed journeypersons currently employed by such sponsor. 50 Failure on behalf of a sponsor to submit such information shall 51 constitute grounds for termination of such sponsor's registered 52 apprenticeship program, provided, such sponsor may register the 53 following year. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 1-210, such 54 information provided by a sponsor shall be considered a public record 55 and all persons shall have the right to inspect and copy such records in 56 accordance with the provisions of section 1-212.

57 [(c)] (d) Fifty per cent of any amount collected by the Labor 58 Department pursuant to this section shall be deposited in the General 59 Fund and fifty per cent of such amount shall be credited to a separate 60 nonlapsing appropriation to the Labor Department, for the purpose of 61 administering the department's apprentice training program and 62 sections 31-22m to 31-22p, inclusive.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:
