## Raised Bill No. 1219

## AN ACT INCREASING THE THRESHOLD AMOUNT FOR FELONY UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION FRAUD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

Section 1. Subsection (f) of section 31-273 of the general statutes is
repealed and the following is substituted in lieu thereof (*Effective October* 1, 2025):

4 (f) Any person who knowingly makes a false statement or 5 representation or fails to disclose a material fact in order to obtain, 6 increase, prevent or decrease any benefit, contribution or other payment 7 under this chapter, or under any similar law of another state or of the 8 United States in regard to which this state acted as agent pursuant to an 9 agreement authorized by section 31-225, whether to be made to or by 10 [himself or herself] such person or any other person, and who receives 11 any such benefit, pays any such contribution or alters any such payment 12 to [his or her] <u>such person's</u> advantage by such fraudulent means (1) 13 shall be guilty of a class A misdemeanor if such benefit, contribution or 14 payment amounts to [five hundred] two thousand dollars or less, or (2) 15 shall be guilty of a class D felony if such benefit, contribution or

- 16 payment amounts to more than [five hundred] two thousand dollars.
- 17 Notwithstanding the provisions of section 54-193, no person shall be
- 18 prosecuted for a violation of the provisions of this subsection committed
- 19 on or after October 1, 1977, except within five years next after such
- 20 violation has been committed.

This act shall take effect as follows and shall amend the following sections:

## Statement of Purpose:

To increase the threshold dollar amount for an individual to become guilty of a felony for receiving unemployment benefits by fraudulent means.
