2	(a) The Department of Health shall conduct a study to evaluate the availability of	
3	affordable long-term care services and supports to DC residents. The study shall:	
4	(1) Review the availability of affordable long-term care facilities including	
5	nursing homes, assisted living residences and community residence facilities in District of	
6	Columbia.	
7	(2) Review the number of available beds for each type of facility along with the	
8	payment source accepted for living at each facility.	
9	(A) Identify an estimated number of DC residents who are receiving long-	
10	term care services and supports in facilities located in Virginia and Maryland;	
11	(B) Review the availability of long-term care services and supports	
12	provided to seniors residing in the community along with source for each service provided;	
13	(C) Identify the number of residents who have been terminated from	
14	services in the past year from in-home long-term care services and supports and have	
15	transitioned to a long-term care facility within and outside of the District of Columbia.	
16	(D) Provide a projection of the number of DC residents who will require
