18	Sec. 2. Definitions.
19	For the purposes of this act, the term:
20	(1) "Department" means the Department of Health.
21	(2) "Long-term care facility" shall have the same meaning as provided in section
22	101(7) of the District of Columbia Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program Act of 1988, effective
23	March 16, 1989 (D.C Law 7-218; D.C. Official Code § 7-701.01(7)).
24	(3) "Long-term care services" shall have the same meaning as provided in section
25	101(7A) of the District of Columbia Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program Act of 1988,
26	effective March 16, 1989 (D.C Law 7-218; D.C. Official Code § 7-701.01(7A)).
27	Sec. 3. Study of long-term care facilities and long-term care services.

(a) The Department, in consultation with residents receiving long-term care services,
providers of long-term care services, community advocates, and any other appropriate District
agencies, shall conduct a study using a community-based participatory research framework to
evaluate the availability of affordable long-term care facilities and long-term care services in the
District. The study shall:
(1) Review the availability of affordable long-term care facilities;
(2) Evaluate the number of beds available at long-term care facilities;
(3) Identify the payment sources accepted by long-term care facilities for the
provision of long-term care services;
(4) Develop an estimate of the number of District residents who receive long-term
care services from long-term care facilities located in Virginia and Maryland;
(5) Assess the availability of long-term care services provided to residents in the
District;
(6) Identify the number of residents receiving long-term care services in the
District who transitioned in the preceding year to a long-term care facility either within or
outside of the District;
(7) Develop an estimate of the number of District residents who may require long-
term care services over the next 10-year period; and
(8) Recommend resources to ensure residents have access to affordable long-term
care services in the District.

48	(b) By February 1, 2019, the Department shall submit the study required by subsection
49	(a) of this section to the Council.
50	Sec. 4. Applicability.
51	(a) This act shall apply upon the date of inclusion of its fiscal effect in an approved
52	budget and financial plan.
53	(b) The Chief Financial Officer shall certify the date of the inclusion of the fiscal effect in
54	an approved budget and financial plan, and provide notice to the Budget Director of the Council
55	of the certification.
56	(c)(1) The Budget Director shall cause the notice of the certification to be published in
57	the District of Columbia Register.
58	(2) The date of publication of the notice of the certification shall not affect the
59	applicability of this act.
60	Sec. 5. Fiscal impact statement.
61	The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement in the committee report as the fiscal
62	impact statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975,
63	approved October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.47a).
64	Sec. 6. Effective date.
65	This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the
66	Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of congressional review as
67	provided in section 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December
