A BILL

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To amend, on an emergency basis, Chapter 26 of Title 18 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations to reduce fines for driving and parking in a bus lane from \$200 to \$100.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the “Clear Lanes Bus Priority Enforcement Regulation Emergency Amendment Act of 2023”.

Sec. 2. Chapter 26 of Title 18 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations is amended as follows:

(a) The chart in 18 DCMR 2600.1 is amended by striking the row that reads

Unauthorized vehicle driving in a [§§2215.5, 4006.1]	\$200.00
--	----------

and inserting a row that reads

Unauthorized vehicle driving in a [§2215.5]	\$100.00
---	----------

in its place.

(b) The chart in 18 DCMR 2601.1 is amended by striking the row that reads

Bus lane, unauthorized vehicle parked in [§ 2405.1(j)]	\$200.00
---	----------

29 and inserting a row that reads

Bus lane, unauthorized vehicle parked in [§ 2405.1(i)]	\$100.00
---	----------

30 in its place.

31 Sec. 3. Fiscal impact statement.

32 The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement of the Budget Director as the fiscal impact
33 statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975, approved
34 October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.47a).

35 Sec. 4. Effective date.

36 This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the
37 Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), and shall remain in effect for no longer than
38 90 days, as provided for emergency acts of the Council of the District of Columbia in section
39 412(a) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 788;
40 D.C. Official Code § 1-204.12(a)).
