A CEREMONAL RESOLUTION

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To recognize June as Men's Health Month and promote public awareness around men's health issues.

WHEREAS, Men's Health Month is part of an ongoing international effort to educate men, boys, and their families about receiving regular disease prevention screening and living healthier lifestyles;

WHEREAS, Men's Health Month began in 1994 with the Congressional passage of Men's Health Week June 10th – 14th, sponsored by Senator Bob Dole and Congressman Bill Richardson;

WHEREAS, the National Men's Health Week bill was signed by President Clinton and became public law on May 31, 1994;

WHEREAS, thousands of organizations across the globe participate in Men's Health Month, promoting the health and wellness of men, boys, fathers, and their families;

48 WHEREAS, the Men’s Health Network sponsors health awareness fairs and events on Capitol
49 Hill that are attended by hundreds of lawmakers and staff;

51 WHEREAS, nationwide, life expectancy for men averages five years fewer than women, with
52 men experiencing higher rates of health problems such as diabetes, obesity, cancer, heart disease, and
53 premature mortality;

55 WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic had a devastating impact on men’s health in the United
56 States, dropping men’s life expectancy by two years according to a study by Oxford University;

58 WHEREAS, the growing epidemic of suicide and substance abuse requires concerted effort to
59 raise awareness of unrecognized and undiagnosed depression and mental stress in men and boys;

61 WHEREAS, Men’s Health Month is a time for the public to recognize the mental and physical
62 health needs of men and boys while encouraging fathers to be role models for their children through
63 preventative health screenings, healthy living and seeking needed help; and

65 WHEREAS, “Wear Blue Day” will be recognized on June 14, 2024 to support men’s health
66 awareness.

68 RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, that this resolution
69 may be cited as the “Men’s Health Month Recognition Resolution of 2024”.

71 Sec. 2. The Council of the District of Columbia recognizes the month of June as Men’s Health
72 Month.

74 Sec. 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon the first date of publication in the
75 District of Columbia Register.
