Enclosed please find the "Wage Theft Prevention Correction and Clarification Emergency Amendment Act of 2014" and its accompanying declaration resolution and temporary legislation. This legislation, if enacted, would clarify and improve the laws prohibiting wage theft and the enforcement of those laws.

On September 19th, the Council enacts Bill 20-671, the "Wage Theft Prevention Act of 2014", to ensure that workers in the District promptly receive the wages and leave to which they are entitled, by strengthening the laws that hold employers responsible for any failure to live up to their obligations. However, Bill 20-671 includes provisions that were legally objectionable, ambiguous, or otherwise problematic based on Office of Attorney General Legal Division. The bills attached would clarify when certain provisions shall take effect; who may bring an action on behalf of an employee, amend criminal penalties, clarify when amounts in the Wage Theft Prevention Fund may be spent, authorize the Mayor to issue rules, and clarify how the Mayor shall make certain information available to manufacturers.

These changes will enhance the ability of the District to enforce laws prohibiting wage theft, thus protecting victims of employers who fail to perform the basic obligation of paying employees for work completed. Also, the rules would further assisted in the implementation of the law.

I urge prompt and favorable consideration of this legislation. Thank you for your consideration.

the request of the Mayor A PROPOSED RESOLUTION IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA To declare the existence of an emergency with respect to the need to clarify and improve the laws prohibiting wage theft and the enforcement of those laws. RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Wage Theft Prevention Correction and Clarification Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2014". Sec. 2. (a) There exists a need to amend the "Wage Theft Prevention Act of 2014", enacted on September 19, 2014 (D.C. Act 20-426; 61 DCR 10157), to clarify when certain provisions shall take effect, who may bring an action on behalf of an employee, amend criminal penalties, clarify when amounts in the Wage Theft Prevention Fund may be spent. authorize the Mayor to issue rules, and clarify how the Mayor shall make certain information available to manufacturers. (b) These changes will enhance the ability of the District to enforce laws prohibiting wage theft, thus protecting victims of employers who fail to perform the basic obligation of paying employees for work completed. Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances

enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the Wage
