Dr. Henry is a public health professional who comes from a diverse background ranging from foreign and domestic consulting services to state and local government programming to academia. Dr. Henry spent over a decade in state (NJ) and local government (Washington, DC) providing grantees with technical assistance as well as addressing health disparities and monitoring and evaluating health promotion programs in underserved populations.
