A PROPOSED RESOLUTION

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To declare the existence of an emergency, due to congressional review, with respect to the need to amend the Department of General Services Establishment Act of 2011 to exempt data that is security-sensitive from public dashboard disclosure requirements.

RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the “Protecting Security-Sensitive Dashboard Data Congressional Review Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2023”.

Sec. 2. (a) On October 18, 2022, the Council adopted the “Protecting Security-Sensitive Dashboard Data Emergency Amendment Act of 2022”. The Act became law on November 21, 2022 and will expire on February 19, 2023.

(b) On November 1, 2022, the Council adopted the “Protecting Security-Sensitive Dashboard Data Temporary Amendment Act of 2022”. The temporary measure was signed by the Mayor on November 22, 2022 and is currently under Congressional review.

(c) The measure will not complete the 30-day Congressional review period until March 8, 2023.

(d) This identical emergency legislation is necessary to prevent a gap in the law between the expiration of the emergency act and the effective date of the temporary act.

35 Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the
36 circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it
37 necessary that the Protecting Security-Sensitive Dashboard Data Congressional Review
38 Emergency Amendment Act of 2023 must be adopted after a single reading.

39 Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
