

A PROPOSED RESOLUTION

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To reappoint Ms. Shana N. Bartley to, and designate her Vice Chairperson of, the Citizen Review Panel.

RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this resolution may be cited as the "Citizen Review Panel Shana N. Bartley Reappointment and Redesignation Resolution of 2023".

Sec. 2: The Council of the District of Columbia reappoints and redesignates:

as a member of the Citizen Review Panel, established by section 351 of the Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect Act of 1977, effective April 12, 2005 (D.C. Law 15-341; D.C. Official Code § 4-1303.51), and as Vice Chairperson of the Citizen Review Panel pursuant to section 352(g) of the Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect Act of 1977, effective April 12, 2005 (D.C. Law 15-341; D.C. Official Code § 4-1303.52(g)), for a term to end April 11, 2024.

Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia shall transmit a copy of this resolution, upon its adoption, to the appointee, the chairperson of the Citizen Review Panel, and to the Office of the Mayor.

Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
