

1 A bill to be entitled
 2 An act relating to prosecution of sexual offenses;
 3 providing a short title; amending s. 775.15, F.S.;
 4 eliminating the statute of limitations for certain
 5 sexual offenses; creating s. 943.17297, F.S.;
 6 requiring the Criminal Justice Standards and Training
 7 Commission to incorporate training in certain
 8 techniques for interviews of victims of traumatic
 9 events; providing an effective date.

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 11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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 13 Section 1. This act may be cited as the "Me Too No More
 14 Act."

15 Section 2. Subsection (20) is added to section 775.15,
 16 Florida Statutes, to read:

17 775.15 Time limitations; general time limitations;
 18 exceptions.—

19 (20) In addition to the time periods prescribed in this
 20 section, a prosecution for any offense under chapter 794, except
 21 a violation of s. 794.024, s. 794.026, s. 794.027, s. 794.03, or
 22 s. 794.075, may be commenced at any time. This subsection
 23 applies to any offense that is not otherwise barred from
 24 prosecution, except an offense the prosecution of which would
 25 have been barred under this section on or before July 1, 2019.

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26 Section 3. Section 943.17297, Florida Statutes, is created
27 to read:

28 943.17297 Training in interviewing traumatized victims.-
29 The commission shall incorporate the subject of techniques for
30 interviews of traumatized persons, such as the Forensic
31 Experiential Trauma Interview technique, which emphasize a
32 victim-centered approach combined with an understating of how
33 individuals process traumatic events.

34 Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2019.
