27 (b) The emergency response mapping data must, at a
28 minimum, meet all of the following requirements:

29 1. Be compatible with software platforms used by local,
30 state, and federal public safety agencies that provide emergency
31 services to the specific school for which the data is provided
32 without requiring such agencies to purchase additional software
33 or requiring the integration of third-party software to view the
34 data;

35 2. Be compatible with security software platforms in use
36 by the specific school for which the data is provided without
37 requiring the local law enforcement agencies or school districts
38 to purchase additional software or requiring the integration of
39 third-party software to view the data;

40 3. Be provided in a printable format;

41 4. Be verified for accuracy by a walk-through of school
42 buildings and grounds;

43 5. Be oriented true north;

44 6. Be overlaid on current aerial imagery or plans of
45 school buildings;

46 7. Contain site-specific labeling that matches the
47 structure of school buildings, including room labels, hallway
48 names, and external door or stairwell numbers and locations of
49 hazards, critical utility locations, key boxes, automated
50 external defibrillators, and trauma kits;

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51 8. Contain site-specific labeling that matches the school
52 grounds, including parking areas, athletic fields, surrounding
53 roads, and neighboring properties; and

54 9. Be overlaid with gridded x/y coordinates.

55 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2023.
