The written request must be notarized and must 356 specify the information to be released and the party authorized 357 to receive the information. Upon receipt of the written request, 358 the custodial agency must release the specified information to 359 the party authorized to receive such information.

360 6. The exemptions in this paragraph apply to information
361 held by an agency before, on, or after the effective date of the
362 exemption.

363 7. Information made exempt under this paragraph may be 364 disclosed pursuant to s. 28.2221 to a title insurer authorized 365 pursuant to s. 624.401 and its affiliates as defined in s. 366 624.10; a title insurance agent or title insurance agency as 367 defined in s. 626.841(1) or (2), respectively; or an attorney 368 duly admitted to practice law in this state and in good standing 369 with The Florida Bar.

8. The exempt status of a home address contained in the Official Records is maintained only during the period when a protected party resides at the dwelling location. Upon conveyance of real property after October 1, 2021, and when such real property no longer constitutes a protected party's home address as defined in sub-subparagraph 1.a., the protected party

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376 must submit a written request to release the removed information 377 to the county recorder. The written request to release the 378 removed information must be notarized, must confirm that a 379 protected party's request for release is pursuant to a 380 conveyance of his or her dwelling location, and must specify the 381 Official Records book and page, instrument number, or clerk's 382 file number for each document containing the information to be 383 released.

384 9. Upon the death of a protected party as verified by a 385 certified copy of a death certificate or court order, any party 386 can request the county recorder to release a protected 387 decedent's removed information unless there is a related request 388 on file with the county recorder for continued removal of the 389 decedent's information or unless such removal is otherwise 390 prohibited by statute or by court order. The written request to 391 release the removed information upon the death of a protected 392 party must attach the certified copy of a death certificate or 393 court order and must be notarized, must confirm the request for 394 release is due to the death of a protected party, and must 395 specify the Official Records book and page number, instrument 396 number, or clerk's file number for each document containing the 397 information to be released. A fee may not be charged for the 398 release of any document pursuant to such request.

399 10. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this400 paragraph, this paragraph is subject to the Open Government

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401 Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand 402 repealed on October 2, 2024, unless reviewed and saved from 403 repeal through reenactment by the Legislature. 404 Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public 405 necessity that the home addresses, telephone numbers, dates of 406 birth, and photographs of current or former clerks of the 407 circuit court, deputy clerks of the circuit court, and clerk of the circuit court personnel; the names, home addresses, 408 409 telephone numbers, dates of birth, and places of employment of 410 the spouses and children of current or former clerks of the 411 circuit court, deputy clerks of the circuit court, and clerk of 412 the circuit court personnel; and the names and locations of 413 schools and day care facilities attended by the children of 414 current or former clerks of the circuit court, deputy clerks of the circuit court, and clerk of the circuit court personnel be 415 416 made exempt from s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and s. 24(a), 417 Article I of the State Constitution. The responsibilities of 418 clerks of the circuit court, deputy clerks of the circuit court, 419 and clerk of the circuit court personnel regularly include 420 involvement in legal enforcement, divorce, and child support proceedings and, as a result, clerks of the circuit court, 421 deputy clerks of the circuit court, and clerk of the circuit 422 423 court personnel have received death threats, harassing telephone 424 calls and e-mails, and threats of physical violence from 425 disgruntled individuals. The Legislature finds that the release

427	clerks of the circuit court, deputy clerks of the circuit court,
428	and clerk of the circuit court personnel in danger of being
429	physically or emotionally harmed or stalked. The Legislature
430	finds that the harm that may result from the release of such
431	personal identifying and location information outweighs any
432	public benefit that may be derived from the disclosure of the
433	information.
