A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 3 of Chapter 8 of Title 34 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to administration of employment security, so as to provide for the development and
- 3 implementation of a state-wide peer workforce navigator pilot program; to provide for
- 4 definitions; to provide for program standards and qualifications; to provide for annual
- 5 reporting by the Commissioner of Labor; to provide for a short title; to provide for related
- 6 matters; to provide for automatic repeal; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Georgia Peer Workforce Navigator Pilot
- 10 Program Act."
- SECTION 2.
- 12 Article 3 of Chapter 8 of Title 34 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 13 administration of employment security, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as
- 14 follows:

- 15 "34-8-72.1.
- 16 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- 17 (1) 'Commissioner' means the Commissioner of Labor of the State of Georgia.
- 18 (2) 'Department' means the Georgia Department of Labor.
- 19 (3) 'Rural county' shall have the same meaning as provided in Code Section 48-7-40.17.
- 20 (4) 'Underserved populations' means individuals:
- 21 (A) With disabilities, low literacy, or limited English proficiency;
- 22 (B) Who are inexperienced or untrained;
- 23 (C) Who have experienced homelessness or may have been out of the workforce for
- 24 <u>an extended period;</u>
- (D) Who reside in rural counties; or
- 26 (E) Who are naturalized citizens, legal permanent residents, or are residing in this state
- on a work-related visa.
- 28 (b) No later than July 1, 2023, the Commissioner shall adopt a state-wide peer workforce
- 29 <u>navigator pilot program.</u> The purpose of the pilot program to shall be to:
- 30 (1) Target underserved populations to which to expand opportunities for employment
- 31 <u>through reemployment services, education or training opportunities, apprenticeships, and</u>
- 32 <u>other models that result in skill development and family-supporting careers;</u>
- 33 (2) Assist individuals with meeting basic employment needs in order to help them persist
- 34 <u>in education and work;</u>
- 35 (3) Connect individuals with services and job training programs provided by career
- 36 <u>centers operated by the department or its workforce partners;</u>
- 37 (4) Conduct outreach and provide individual assistance and education to individuals
- 38 applying for and making ongoing claims for unemployment compensation benefits,
- 39 <u>including partial unemployment benefits and assistance for dislocated or marginalized</u>
- 40 workers; and

41 (5) Identify historical issues that have created barriers to successful reemployment for

- 42 <u>individuals seeking jobs, including improvements to the unemployment insurance</u>
- program, to reduce those barriers.
- 44 (c) The department shall provide for the operation of the state-wide peer workforce
- 45 <u>navigator pilot program for a period of three years. The Commissioner shall, through the</u>
- 46 promulgation of rules and regulations, establish the qualifications for entities applying to
- 47 receive procurement contracts or grants to serve as peer workforce navigators. Such
- 48 qualifications shall require that the entity:
- 49 (1) Demonstrate that it has existing peer relationships with at least 100 individuals who
- are a part of underserved populations;
- 51 (2) Be a recognized advocate and source of support for underserved populations, such
- 52 <u>as a labor union, worker organization, nonprofit community group, or similar entity;</u>
- 53 (3) Have the capability to carry out the duties of this Code section, including knowledge
- of eligibility requirements and application processes related to the unemployment
- insurance program provided for in this chapter, reemployment services, education and
- training services, and other resources necessary to help underserved populations increase
- 57 <u>their economic security;</u>
- 58 (4) Comply with all applicable confidentiality provisions of state and federal law to
- ensure the privacy of the information collected from individuals receiving services of the
- 60 pilot program:
- 61 (5) Provide services pursuant to this Code section without charge to the individuals
- receiving those services;
- 63 (6) Provide a performance bond or a letter of credit;
- 64 (7) Ensure that the services provided are linguistically appropriate to the individuals
- being served, recognizing the varying levels of digital literacy and access to technology
- among individuals in need of services; and

67 (8) Meet any other criteria as the Commissioner shall deem necessary to ensure that the

- pilot program operates in accordance with the provisions of this Code section.
- 69 (d) The contracts or grants awarded to qualified entities pursuant to this Code section shall
- 70 <u>be for the duration of the pilot program as long as the qualified entities satisfy performance</u>
- 51 standards set forth in the contracts for the provided services.
- 72 (e) The services provided by qualified entities that receive navigator contracts or grants
- shall be coordinated with and supplement, not supplant, other services provided by the
- 74 <u>department</u>.
- 75 (f) The department shall seek all available workforce development funds, including, but
- not limited to, funding under 29 U.S.C. Section 3101, the federal Workforce Innovation
- and Opportunity Act, that may be available for the pilot program.
- 78 (g) For the duration of the pilot program, the Commissioner shall submit an annual
- detailed, written report on the implementation and effectiveness of the pilot program to the
- 80 Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President of the Senate.
- 81 The final report shall also include recommendations as to expansion of the pilot program
- state wide.
- 83 (h) This Code section shall be repealed in its entirety on December 31, 2026, unless
- 84 <u>extended by an Act of the General Assembly."</u>

85 SECTION 3.

86 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
