A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 10A of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to licensing provisions relative to professional counselors, social workers, and
- 3 marriage and family therapists, so as to provide for and change definitions; to change certain
- 4 education requirements for licensure as a professional counselor or associate professional
- 5 counselor; to provide for privileged communications with clients; to provide for statutory
- 6 construction; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 7 purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 SECTION 1.

- 10 Article 1 of Chapter 10A of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 11 licensing provisions relative to professional counselors, social workers, and marriage and
- 12 family therapists, is amended by adding a new paragraph to and revising paragraphs (8) and
- 13 (20) of Code Section 43-10A-3, relating to definitions, to read as follows:
- 14 "(5.1) 'Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs'
- means the national accrediting agency for professional counseling education as
- recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation."

"(8) 'Diagnose' means the use, administration, or application of any criteria contained within standard classification or diagnostic systems for mental disorders and that are related to the scope of practice as provided pursuant to this article. Such term shall not

mean the diagnosis of any neuropsychological functioning or conditions."

"(20) 'Supervisor' means a person who meets the requirements established by the standards committee for that specialty which is being supervised and who is either licensed under this article or is a psychiatrist or a psychologist."

- 25 Said article is further amended by revising of Code Section 43-10A-11, relating to
- 26 requirements for licensure as an associate professional counselor or professional counselor,
- 27 as follows:

- 29 (a) The education, experience, and training requirements for licensure in professional counseling are as follows:
- 31 (1) For licensure as an associate professional counselor:
- 32 (A) A minimum of an earned master's degree or higher from a regionally accredited 33 program in clinical counseling or counseling psychology that consists of at least 60 34 semester hours or 80 90 quarter hours with an approved supervised internship or
- practicum that is primarily counseling in content as a part of the degree program;
- provided, however, that on and after May 31, 2026, any degrees must be from a

program accredited by the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related

- 38 Educational Programs; and
- 39 (B) Registration with the board of an acceptable contract for obtaining the post-degree
- 40 experience under direction and supervision that is required for licensure as a
- 41 professional counselor.
- 42 (2) For licensure as a professional counselor:

43 (A)(i) A minimum of an earned master's degree or higher from a regionally accredited 44 program in clinical counseling or counseling psychology that consists of at least 60 45 semester hours or 80 90 quarter hours with an approved supervised internship or 46 practicum that is primarily counseling in content as a part of the degree program; 47 provided, however, that on and after May 31, 2026, any degrees must be from a program accredited by the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related 48 49 Educational Programs; and 50 (ii)(B) Two years of post-degree experience under direction and supervision in a work 51 setting acceptable to the board; or 52 (B) A doctoral degree from a recognized educational institution in a program that is primarily counseling in content and requires at least one year of supervised internship 53 54 in a work setting acceptable to the board. 55 (b) For purposes of subsection (a) of this Code section, work settings acceptable to the 56 board may include, but are not limited to, educational, rehabilitation, career development, 57 mental health, or community organizations. 58 59 60

(c) Only a person licensed as an associate professional counselor may use the title 'associate professional counselor' or 'licensed associate professional counselor.' Associate professional counselors shall practice professional counseling only under direction and supervision and only for a period not to exceed five years while obtaining the post-degree experience required for licensure as a professional counselor."

64 Said article is further amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

The confidential relations and communications between a client and a licensed professional 66

counselor, a licensed associate professional counselor, a master's social worker, a licensed 67

clinical social worker, a licensed marriage and family therapist, or a licensed associate 68

69 marriage and family therapist, are placed upon the same basis as those provided by law
70 between attorney and client; and nothing in this article shall be construed to require any

71 <u>such privileged communications to be disclosed."</u>

72 SECTION 4.

- 73 Said article is further amended by revising Code Section 43-10A-22, relating to restrictions
- on the scope of article, as follows:
- 75 "43-10A-22.
- Nothing in this article shall be construed to authorize persons licensed under this article to
- practice nursing, occupational therapy, physical therapy, medicine, or psychology, as
- 78 regulated under Chapters 26, 28, 33, 34, and 39, respectively, of this title nor shall anything
- in this article be construed to limit or regulate the practice of those licensed under Chapters
- 80 26, 28, 33, 34, and 39 of this title, nor shall anything in this article be construed to
- 81 authorize persons licensed under this article to perform psychological testing as defined in
- 82 Code Section 43-39-1."

SECTION 5.

84 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
