## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Part 3 of Article 16 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 2 Annotated, relating to student health in elementary and secondary education, so as to enact
- 3 the "Jason Flatt Act-Georgia"; to provide for legislative findings; to require annual suicide
- 4 prevention education training for school system personnel; to provide that no cause of action
- 5 is created; to provide that no duty of care is created; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 6 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

9 This Act shall be known and may be referred to as the "Jason Flatt Act-Georgia."

SECTION 2.

- 11 The General Assembly finds that:
- 12 (1) Suicide cuts across ethnic, economic, social, and age boundaries and has a tremendous
- and traumatic impact on surviving family members, friends, and the community at large;
- 14 (2) After unintentional injury, suicide has become the leading cause of death among young
- people between the ages of ten and 24. At a time when unintentional injuries have been
- on the decline, suicides have increased; and
- 17 (3) Suicide is a complex issue that requires school, family, and community resources be
- harnessed for appropriate and timely help to be available in order to prevent suicide.

19 SECTION 3.

- 20 Part 3 of Article 16 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 21 relating to student health in elementary and secondary education, is amended by adding a
- 22 new Code section to read as follows:

- 24 (a)(1) The Department of Education shall adopt rules to require that all public school
- 25 personnel receive annual training in suicide awareness and prevention. This training shall
- 26 <u>be provided within the framework of existing in-service training programs offered by the</u>
- 27 <u>Department of Education or as part of required professional development offered by a</u>
- 28 <u>local school system.</u>
- 29 (2) The Department of Education shall, in consultation with the Department of Public
- 30 Health, the Suicide Prevention Program established pursuant to Code Section 37-1-27,
- 31 <u>and suicide prevention experts, develop a list of approved training materials to fulfill the</u>
- 32 requirements of this subsection which may include training materials currently being used
- by a local school system if such training materials meet any criteria established by the
- 34 <u>department.</u>
- 35 (3) Approved materials shall include training on how to identify appropriate mental
- 36 <u>health services, both within the school and also within the larger community, and when</u>
- and how to refer youth and their families to those services.
- 38 (4) Approved materials may include programs that can be completed through self-review
- 39 <u>of suitable suicide prevention materials.</u>
- 40 (b) No person shall have a cause of action for any loss or damage caused by any act or
- 41 omission resulting from the implementation of the provisions of this Code section or
- 42 <u>resulting from any training, or lack thereof, required by this Code section.</u>
- 43 (c) The training, or lack thereof, required by the provisions of this Code section shall not
- 44 <u>be construed to impose any specific duty of care."</u>

45 SECTION 4.

46 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
