The House Committee on Public Safety and Homeland Security offers the following substitute to HB 1145:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Part 1 of Article 5 of Chapter 9 of Title 45 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to Georgia State Indemnification Fund, so as to provide that the death of a public safety officer due to COVID-19 in certain instances be considered a death in the line of duty for purposes of indemnification; to provide clarification for instances of heart attack, stroke, or vascular rupture; to provide authorization for the appropriation of money; to revise and provide for a definition; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:
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SECTION 1.

Part 1 of Article 5 of Chapter 9 of Title 45 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
relating to Georgia State Indemnification Fund, is amended by revising Code Section
45-9-84.2, relating to Georgia State Indemnification Fund — authorization for appropriation
of moneys to the fund and moneys from other sources, as follows:

- 14 "45-9-84.2.
- 15 The General Assembly is authorized to appropriate funds to be placed in the Georgia State
 16 Indemnification Fund for the purpose of providing for indemnification with respect to the

17 death or disability of any law enforcement officer, firefighter, or prison guard who is or has 18 been killed or permanently disabled in the line of duty subsequent to January 1, 1973, the 19 death or disability of any emergency medical technician who is killed or permanently 20 disabled or has been killed or permanently disabled in the line of duty subsequent to 21 January 1, 1977, the death or disability of any emergency management rescue specialist 22 who is killed or permanently disabled on or after January 1, 1991, and the death or 23 disability of any state highway employee who is or has been killed or permanently disabled 24 in the line of duty subsequent to January 1, 1990 Pursuant to Article III, Section VI, 25 Paragraph VI, subparagraphs (d), (e), and (g) of the Georgia Constitution, the General 26 Assembly is authorized to appropriate funds to be placed in the Georgia State 27 Indemnification Fund for the purpose of providing indemnification with respect to the 28 death or disability of any law enforcement officer, firefighter, prison guard, emergency 29 management rescue specialist, or publicly employed emergency medical technician who 30 is or has been killed or permanently disabled in the line of duty subsequent to January 1, 31 2000, and the death or disability of any state highway employee who is or has been killed 32 or permanently disabled in the line of duty subsequent to January 1, 2011, as well as 33 defraying the expenses and costs incurred by the department and the commission in the 34 administration of this part. In addition, the department is authorized to accept for deposit 35 in the Georgia State Indemnification Fund any other funds from any other source. All 36 funds appropriated to the Georgia State Indemnification Fund shall be presumptively 37 concluded to have been committed to the purpose for which they have been appropriated 38 and shall not lapse."

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SECTION 2.

Said part is further amended by revising Code Section 45-9-85, relating to payment of
indemnification for death or disability, procedure for making payments, and appeal, as
follows:

127 Said part is further amended by revising Code Section 45-9-88, relating to indemnification

not to be awarded when penal violation, suicide, intentionally self-inflicted injuries, natural
causes, or performance of certain routine duties caused or contributed to death or disability,

(a) No indemnification shall be awarded to any person otherwise entitled thereto who
violates a penal law of this state which violation caused or contributed to the death or
disability of the officer.

(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this article part, no payment shall be authorized
if death, organic brain damage, total permanent disability, or partial permanent disability
occurs from suicide, intentionally self-inflicted injuries, natural causes, or the performance
of routine duties which would not be considered strenuous or dangerous by a reasonable

141 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
