# A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Chapter 4 of Title 1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
holidays and observances, so as to designate the appropriate date of each year as the "Lunar
New Year" in Georgia; to provide legislative findings; to provide for related matters; to
repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

# BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

## **SECTION 1.**

7 The General Assembly finds that:

8 (1) The Lunar New Year marks the beginning of a new lunar calendar year, which
9 measures time based upon the cycles of the moon, and has been celebrated for thousands
10 of years in many countries;

(2) According to one legend, Buddha invited the animals of the world to visit him on the
Lunar New Year, rewarding those who came by naming a year in their honor. Each
animal, in turn, gave its characteristics to those born during its year;

14 (3) The Lunar New Year is a festival of great importance in Asian American
15 communities. It promotes both goodwill and self-reflection and is a joyous occasion
16 welcomed annually with distinguishing festivities and much preparation;

| 17 | (4) The celebration of the Lunar New Year is a tradition by which Asian Americans           |

| 18 | proclaim the arrival of a new year and look forward to what the new year will bring;        |
| 19 | (5) Each year, many people of this state unite to celebrate the Lunar New Year, joining     |
| 20 | to commemorate Asian American joy, cultures, and diversity; and                             |
| 21 | (6) It is, therefore, abundantly fitting and proper that the State of Georgia appropriately |
| 22 | recognize and celebrate Asian American culture and tradition by designating the             |
| 23 | appropriate date of each year as the "Lunar New Year" in Georgia.                           |

| 24 | <b>SECTION 2.</b>   |
| 25 | Chapter 4 of Title 1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to holidays and    |
| 26 | observances, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:                    |
| 27 | ″ <u>1-4-27.</u>  |
| 28 | The date of each year that corresponds with the second new moon following the winter        |
| 29 | solstice, or the third new moon following the winter solstice should an intercalary month   |
| 30 | intervene, is designated as the 'Lunar New Year' in Georgia."                               |

| 31 | SECTION 3.  |

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed. 32
