## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 48-8-3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, r
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- 2 exemptions from sales and use tax, so as to exempt sales of tangible personal property to or
- 3 used in or for the renovation or expansion of certain museums; to define a term; to provide
- 4 for limitations; to provide for automatic repeal; to provide for related matters; to provide for
- 5 an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Code Section 48-8-3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to exemptions from
- 9 sales and use tax, is amended by revising paragraph (77) as follows:
- 10 "(77)(A) Notwithstanding any provision of Code Section 48-8-63 to the contrary, from
- July 1, 2022, until July 30, 2025, sales of tangible personal property to or used in or for
- the renovation or expansion of a civil rights museum.
- (B) As used in this paragraph, the term 'civil rights museum' means any museum that
- was constructed after July 1, 2009, is larger than 40,000 square feet, and contains
- special event space and retail space, provided that such museum is owned or operated

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16	by an organization which is exempt from taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the
17	Internal Revenue Code.
18	(C) Any person making a sale of tangible personal property for the purpose specified
19	in this paragraph shall collect the tax imposed on this sale unless the purchaser
20	furnishes such person with an exemption determination letter issued by the
21	commissioner certifying that the purchaser is entitled to purchase the tangible personal
22	property without paying the tax.
23	(D) The exemption allowed by this paragraph shall not apply to a transaction that
24	occurs on or after the date when a civil rights museum opens to the public following the
25	renovation or expansion required by this paragraph.
26	(E) This paragraph shall stand repealed and reserved on August 1, 2025 Reserved;"
27	SECTION 2.
28	This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2022.

30 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
