A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

1 To amend Chapter 7 of Title 48 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
2 income taxes, so as to revise a tax credit for certain medical preceptor rotations; to add
3 dentistry; to increase the value of the tax credit; to revise definitions; to provide for an
4 aggregate annual cap; to extend the sunset provision for such tax credit; to provide for related
5 matters; to provide for an effective date and applicability; to repeal conflicting laws; and for
6 other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 **SECTION 1.**

9 Chapter 7 of Title 48 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to income taxes,
10 is amended by revising Code Section 48-7-29.22, relating to tax credits for certain medical
11 preceptor rotations, as follows:

12 "48-7-29.22.

13 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:

14 (1) 'Advanced practice registered nurse student' means an individual participating in a
15 training program in this state that is accredited by a nationally recognized accrediting

16 body for advanced practice registered nursing programs for the training of individuals to
17 become advanced practice registered nurses as defined in Code Section 43-26-3.

18 (2) 'Community based faculty preceptor' means an individual who is a physician as
19 defined in Code Section 43-34-21, a licensed dentist as defined in Code Section 43-11-1,
20 an advanced practice registered nurse as defined in Code Section 43-26-3, or a physician
21 assistant as defined in Code Section 43-34-102 and who is licensed as such by this state.

22 (3) 'Medical student' means an individual participating in a training program in this state
23 that is approved by the Georgia Composite Medical Board for the training of doctors of
24 medicine or doctors of osteopathic medicine or by the Georgia Board of Dentistry for the
25 training of dentists.

26 (4) 'Physician assistant student' means an individual participating in a training program
27 in this state that is approved by the Georgia Composite Medical Board for the training of
28 individuals to become physician assistants as defined in Code Section 43-34-102.

29 (5) 'Preceptorship rotation' means a period of preceptorship training of one or more
30 medical students, physician assistant students, or advanced practice registered nurse
31 students that in aggregate totals 160 hours.

32 (6) 'Preceptorship training' means uncompensated community based training of a medical
33 student, advanced practice registered nurse student, or physician assistant student
34 matriculating in a training program in Georgia.

35 (b)(1) A community based faculty preceptor shall be allowed a credit against the tax
36 imposed by Code Section 48-7-20 if he or she conducts a preceptorship rotation.

37 (2) Such credit shall be accrued on a per preceptorship rotation basis in the amount of
38 ~~\$500.00 for the first, second, or third preceptorship rotation and \$1,000.00 for the fourth,~~
39 ~~fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, or tenth~~ \$1,000.00 for each preceptorship rotation
40 completed in one calendar year by a community based faculty preceptor who is a
41 physician as defined in Code Section 43-34-21 or a licensed dentist as defined in Code
42 Section 43-11-1 and ~~\$375.00 for the first, second, or third preceptorship rotation and~~

43 ~~\$750.00 for the fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, or tenth~~ \$750.00 for each
44 preceptorship rotation completed in one calendar year by a community based faculty
45 preceptor who is an advanced practice registered nurse as defined in Code Section
46 43-26-3 or a physician assistant as defined in Code Section 43-34-102.

47 (3) An individual shall not accrue credit for more than ten preceptorship rotations in one
48 calendar year.

49 (4) The aggregate amount of tax credits allowed pursuant to this Code section shall not
50 exceed \$6 million for any calendar year.

51 (c)(1) A community based faculty preceptor shall not be eligible to earn hours credited
52 toward preceptorship training if he or she has not registered with the state-wide Area
53 Health Education Centers (AHEC) Program Office at Augusta University.

54 (2) The AHEC Program Office at Augusta University shall administer the Preceptor Tax
55 Incentive Program established pursuant to this Code section and certify preceptorship
56 rotations for the department on behalf of all eligible public and private training programs
57 for medicine, osteopathic medicine, dentistry, advanced practice nursing, and physician
58 assistant at institutions in this state for the department.

59 (d) To receive the credit allowed by this Code section, a community based faculty
60 preceptor shall claim such credit on his or her return for the tax year in which he or she
61 completed the preceptorship rotation; shall certify that he or she did not receive payment
62 during such tax year from any source for the training of a medical student, advanced
63 practice registered nurse student, or physician assistant student; and shall submit supporting
64 documentation as prescribed by the commissioner.

65 (e) In no event shall the total amount of the tax credit under this Code section for a taxable
66 year exceed the taxpayer's income tax liability. No such tax credit shall be allowed the
67 taxpayer against prior or succeeding years' tax liability.

68 (f)(1) On August 1, 2020, and annually thereafter, the commissioner and the AHEC
69 Program Office at Augusta University shall issue a report to the Governor, the

70 chairperson of the Senate Finance Committee, and the chairperson of the House
71 Committee on Ways and Means concerning the tax credit created by this Code section.

72 (2) Such report shall include, for the prior calendar year, the:

73 (A) Number of community based faculty preceptors claiming a credit;

74 (B) Total number of preceptorship rotations completed;

75 (C) Number of medical students, advanced practice registered nurse students, and
76 physician assistant students who participated in a preceptorship rotation; and

77 (D) Total amount of credits awarded pursuant to this Code section.

78 (g) The commissioner shall be authorized to promulgate any rules and regulations
79 necessary to implement and administer the provisions of this Code section.

80 (h) This Code section shall stand repealed by operation of law at the last moment of
81 December 31, ~~2026~~ 2030."

82 **SECTION 2.**

83 This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2025, and shall be applicable to all taxable years
84 beginning on or after January 1, 2026.

85 **SECTION 3.**

86 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
