A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 2 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the
- 2 Department of Community Health, so as to reinstate a pilot program to provide coverage for
- 3 bariatric surgical procedures for the treatment and management of obesity and related
- 4 conditions under the state health insurance plan; to provide for definitions; to provide for
- 5 eligibility, requirements, and evaluation report for the four-year pilot program; to provide for
- 6 automatic repeal; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 7 purposes.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 **SECTION 1.**

- 10 Chapter 2 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to the Department
- of Community Health, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 12 <u>"31-2-12.</u>
- 13 (a) As used in this Code section, the term 'state health insurance plan' means:
- 14 (1) The state employees' health insurance plan established pursuant to Article 1 of
- 15 Chapter 18 of Title 45;
- 16 (2) The health insurance plan for public school teachers established pursuant to Subpart
- 2 of Part 6 of Article 17 of Chapter 2 of Title 20; and
- 18 (3) The health insurance plan for public school employees established pursuant to
- 19 Subpart 3 of Part 6 of Article 17 of Chapter 2 of Title 20.
- 20 (b) The department shall conduct a four-year pilot program beginning January 1, 2020, to
- 21 provide coverage for the treatment and management of obesity and related conditions under
- 22 <u>a state health insurance plan. The department shall be authorized to enter into an</u>
- 23 agreement with a postsecondary institution in this state for pilot program management, data
- 24 <u>collection</u>, patient engagement, and other activities related to the pilot program. The pilot
- 25 <u>program will provide benefits for medically necessary bariatric procedures for participants</u>
- 26 <u>selected for inclusion in the pilot program.</u>

27 (c) Participation in the pilot program shall be limited to no more than 250 individuals per

- 28 year, to be selected in a manner determined by the department. Any person who has
- 29 <u>elected coverage under a state health insurance plan shall be eligible to be selected to</u>
- 30 participate in the pilot program in accordance with criteria established by the department
- 31 which shall include, but not be limited to:
- 32 (1) Participating in a state health insurance plan for at least 12 months;
- 33 (2) Completing a health risk assessment through a state health insurance plan;
- 34 (3) Having a body mass index of:
- 35 (A) Greater than 40; or
- 36 (B) Greater than 35 with one or more comorbidities such as diabetes, hypertension,
- 37 gastroesophageal reflux disease, sleep apnea, or asthma;
- 38 (4) Consenting to provide personal and medical information to a state health insurance
- 39 plan;
- 40 (5) Being a non-tobacco user;
- 41 (6) Having no other primary group health coverage or primary coverage with Medicare;
- 42 <u>and</u>
- 43 (7) Having been covered under a state health insurance plan for two years immediately
- prior to the pilot program and expressing an intent to continue coverage under such
- 45 <u>insurance plan for two years following the approved surgical procedure date.</u>
- 46 (d) Eligible individuals must apply to participate in the pilot program. The individual and
- 47 <u>his or her physician shall complete and submit an obesity treatment program application</u>
- 48 <u>to the department no later than February 1 for each year of the pilot program. The</u>
- 49 <u>department's contracted health insurance carrier shall review the criteria contained in</u>
- 50 <u>subsection (c) of this Code section to determine qualified applicants for the pilot program.</u>
- 51 (e) The selected participants shall be eligible to receive a multidisciplinary health
- 52 <u>evaluation at a facility located within the State of Georgia which is designated by the</u>
- 53 American Society for Metabolic and Bariatric Surgery as a Bariatric Surgery Center of
- 54 Excellence. The bariatric surgical procedures covered in the pilot program shall be:
- 55 (1) Gastric band;
- 56 (2) Laparoscopic sleeve gastrectomy; and
- 57 (3) Roux-en-Y gastric bypass.
- The participants shall use the department's contracted health insurance carrier to enroll in
- 59 <u>a case management program and to receive prior authorization for a surgical procedure</u>
- 60 provided pursuant to the pilot program. The health insurance carrier shall provide case
- 61 <u>management and patient follow-up services.</u> Benefits for a bariatric surgical procedure
- 62 <u>under the pilot program shall be provided only when the surgical procedure is performed</u>
- at a Center of Excellence within the State of Georgia.

64 (f) All health care services provided pursuant to the pilot program shall be subject to the

- 65 <u>health insurance carrier's plan of benefits and policy provisions.</u> Complications that arise
- after the discharge date are subject to the health insurance carrier's plan of benefits and
- 67 policy provisions.
- 68 (g) Participants must agree to comply with any and all terms and conditions of the pilot
- 69 program including, but not limited to, participation and reporting requirements.
- 70 Participation requirements shall include a 12 month postsurgery case management
- 71 program. Each participant must also agree to comply with any and all requests by the
- 72 <u>department for postsurgical medical and productivity information, and such agreement</u>
- shall survive his or her participation in a state health insurance plan.
- 74 (h) A panel shall review the results and outcomes of the pilot program beginning six
- 75 months after program initiation and shall conduct subsequent reviews every six months for
- 76 the remainder of the pilot program. The panel shall be composed of the following
- 77 <u>members, appointed by the Governor:</u>
- 78 (1) A representative of a state health insurance plan;
- 79 (2) A representative of the state contracted health insurance carrier or carriers providing
- 80 coverage under the pilot program; and
- 81 (3) At least two physicians who carry a certification by the American Society for
- 82 <u>Metabolic and Bariatric Surgery.</u>
- 83 (i) The department shall provide a final report by June 30, 2024, to the chairpersons of the
- 84 <u>House Committee on Health and Human Services, the Senate Health and Human Services</u>
- 85 <u>Committee, the House Committee on Appropriations, and the Senate Appropriations</u>
- 86 <u>Committee. The report shall include, at a minimum:</u>
- 87 (1) Whether patients in the pilot program have experienced:
- 88 (A) A reduction in body mass index, and if so, the average amount of reduction; or
- 89 (B) The reduction or elimination of comorbidities, and if so, which comorbidities were
- 90 <u>reduced or eliminated;</u>
- 91 (2) The total number of individuals who applied to participate in the pilot program;
- 92 (3) The total number of participants who enrolled in the pilot program;
- 93 (4) The average cost of each procedure conducted under the pilot program, including
- gastric band, laparoscopic sleeve gastrectomy, and Roux-en-Y gastric bypass;
- 95 (5) The total cost of each participant's annual health care costs prior to the surgical
- procedure and for each of the subsequent post-procedure years for the three years
- 97 <u>following the surgical procedure; and</u>
- 98 (6) The percentage of participants still employed by the state 12 months following the
- 99 <u>surgical procedure and 24 months following the surgical procedure.</u>
- (j) This Code section shall stand repealed on June 30, 2024."

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
