The House Committee on Transportation offers the following substitute to HB 189:

# A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Article 2 of Chapter 6 of Title 32 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to dimensions and weight of vehicles and loads, so as to provide for an allowable variance for weight limitations upon a vehicle or load for vehicles hauling certain products within certain areas; to remove a prohibition on the use of lift axle for computations of weight; to provide for penalties for excess weight; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

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### BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

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#### **SECTION 1.**

9 Article 2 of Chapter 6 of Title 32 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
10 dimensions and weight of vehicles and loads, is amended in Code Section 32-6-26, relating
11 to weight of vehicle and load, by revising subsection (g) as follows:

12 "(g)(1) The weight limitations provided for in this Code section, except the limitation in 13 subsections (f) and (h) of this Code section, may be exceeded on any public road within 14 this state which is not an interstate highway, or when making a pickup or delivery on any 15 public road of a county road system, without a permit only when the load on any single 16 axle does not exceed 23,000 pounds, the load on any tandem axle does not exceed 46,000

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17 pounds, and the maximum total gross weight of the vehicle and load does not exceed 18 80,000 pounds when: 19 (A) Hauling forest products from the forest where cut to the first point of marketing or 20 processing: 21 (B) Hauling live poultry or cotton from a farm to a processing plant; 22 (C) Hauling feed from a feed mill to a farm; 23 (D) Hauling granite, either block or sawed, or any other naturally occurring raw ore or 24 mineral for further processing, from the quarry or stockpile area to a processing plant 25 located in the same or an adjoining county and construction aggregates hauled to any 26 point, unless otherwise prohibited; 27 (E) Hauling solid waste or recovered materials from points of generation to a solid 28 waste handling facility or other processing facility; 29 (F) Hauling concrete that is in a freshly mixed and unhardened state for delivery to a 30 customer; or 31 (G) Hauling poultry waste from the point of origin to a farm. 32 No lift axle may be used in computing the maximum total gross weight authorized for 33 any vehicle or load under this paragraph. 34 (2) A vehicle which is hauling the products listed in subparagraphs (A) through (F) of 35 paragraph (1) of this subsection or which is hauling any other agricultural or farm product 36 from a farm to the first point of marketing or processing shall be permitted a 5 percent 37 variance from the weight limitations in paragraph (1) of this subsection within a 100 mile 38 radius of the farm or point of origin. Any person who violates the load limitations 39 provided for in this paragraph by exceeding the 5 percent variance per single axle, 40 tandem axle, or maximum total gross weight shall be fined on the basis of the weight 41 limitations of paragraph (1) of this subsection, including the variance allowed by this 42 paragraph.

43	(3)(2) A vehicle which is hauling the products listed in subparagraph subparagraphs (A)
44	through (G) of paragraph (1) of this subsection or which is hauling any other agricultural
45	or farm product from a farm to the first point of marketing or processing shall be
46	permitted a $\frac{5}{12.5}$ percent variance from the weight limitations in paragraph (1) of this
47	subsection within a 250 mile radius of the farm or point of origin, provided that the
48	tractor and trailer are certified to meet or exceed the weight allowable by such variance.
49	Any person who violates the load limitations provided for in this paragraph by exceeding
50	the $\frac{5}{12.5}$ percent variance per single axle, tandem axle, or maximum total gross weight
51	shall be fined on the basis of the weight limitations of paragraph (1) of this subsection
52	and not on the basis of the variance allowed by this paragraph.
53	(4)(3) Any vehicle carrying a load as authorized in this subsection at night shall be

(4)(5) Any vehicle carrying a load as authorized in this subsection at hight shall be equipped with lights clearly visible for a distance of not less than 300 feet from the front and rear of the vehicle."

56	SECTION 2.
57	Said article is further amended in Code Section 32-6-27, relating to enforcement of load
58	limitations, by revising paragraph (1) of subsection (a) as follows:
59	''(1)(A) When the weight of the vehicle is less that 95,000 pounds, 5¢ Five cents per
60	pound for all excess weight over the allowed weight limitations, not including any
61	applicable variances:
62	(B) When the weight of the vehicle is greater than 95,000 pounds, 10¢ per pound for
63	all excess weight over the allowed weight limitations, not including any applicable
64	variances; and
65	(C) When the weight of the vehicle is greater than 100,000 pounds, 15¢ per pound for
66	all excess weight over the allowed weight limitations, not including any applicable
67	variances;"

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## **SECTION 3.**

69 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
