The Senate Committee on Finance offered the following substitute to HB 225:

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Code Section 48-8-3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to

exemptions from sales and use taxes, so as to revise an exemption regarding for-hire

vehicles; to provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting

laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

6 SECTION 1.

Code Section 48-8-3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to exemptions from sales and use taxes, is amended by revising paragraph (25) as follows:

"(25) On and after July 1, 2017, fares of for-hire vehicles, for which including taxi services, limousine carriers, transportation referral services, transportation referral service providers, and ride share network services, or the owners of such vehicles have purchased a for-hire master license in lieu of paying sales and use taxes on fares pursuant to the provisions of subsection (b) of Code Section 40-2-168. Such exemption shall also apply to all sales taxes, use taxes, or local sales and use taxes levied or imposed at any time in any area consisting of less than the entire state, however authorized, including, but not limited to, such taxes authorized by or pursuant to Section 25 of an Act approved March 10, 1965 (Ga. L. 1965, p. 2243), as amended, the 'Metropolitan Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority Act of 1965,' and such taxes as authorized by or pursuant to Article 2, 2A, 3, 4, 5, or 5A of this chapter. This provision shall not relieve taxi services, limousine carriers, transportation referral services, transportation referral service providers, or ride share service networks of sales and use tax liability on fares incurred prior to the purchase of such for-hire master license. This paragraph shall be repealed by operation of law on July 1, 2017;"

24 SECTION 2.

This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2017.

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26 SECTION 3.

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
