## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 15-9-2.1, Title 16, Title 19, Title 20, Chapter 2 of Title 38,
- 2 Chapter 2 of Title 40, and Title 47, relating to appointment, compensation, authority,
- 3 qualifications, training, and other limitations of associate probate court judges, crimes and
- 4 offenses, domestic relations, education, military affairs, registration and licensing of motor
- 5 vehicles, and retirement and pensions, respectively, so as to add appropriate references to the
- 6 United States Space Force; to make conforming changes; to provide for related matters; to
- 7 repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 SECTION 1.

- 10 Code Section 15-9-2.1, relating to appointment, compensation, authority, qualifications,
- 11 training, and other limitations of associate probate court judges, is amended by revising
- 12 paragraph (1) of subsection (e) as follows:
- "(1) It shall be unlawful for any associate judge of the probate court to engage directly
- or indirectly in the practice of law in his or her own name or in the name of another as a
- partner in any manner in any case, proceeding, or matter of any kind in his or her own
- 16 court or in any other court in any case, proceeding, or any other matters of which his or

her own court has pending jurisdiction or has jurisdiction. It shall be unlawful for any associate judge of the probate court to give advice or counsel to any individual on any matter of any kind whatsoever that has arisen directly or indirectly in his or her own court. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to limit in any way the ability of an associate judge of the probate court to serve as or offer advice in his or her role as a judge advocate or in any other military role in an active duty or reserve component of the United States Army, United States Navy, United States Marine Corps, United States Coast Guard, United States Air Force, United States Space Force, United States National Guard, Georgia National Guard, Georgia Naval Militia, the Georgia State Defense Force, or in the National Guard or Air National Guard of any state or territory of the United States."

28 SECTION 2.

29 Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to crimes and offenses, is

30 amended in Code Section 16-9-63, relating to false representation as veteran, by revising

31 paragraph (1) of subsection (a) as follows:

32 "(a) As used in this Code section, the term:

33 (1) 'Armed forces of the United States' means the army, navy, air force, space force,

marine corps, or coast guard and the reserve components thereof and the uniformed

components of the Public Health Service or the National Oceanic and Atmospheric

Administration."

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37 SECTION 3.

38 Said title is further amended in Code Section 16-11-124, relating to exemptions from

39 application of part, by revising paragraph (2) of subsection (a) as follows:

"(2) A member of the National Guard or of the armed forces of the United States to wit:
 the army, navy, marine corps, air force, space force, or coast guard who, while serving
 therein, possesses such firearm in the line of duty;"

43 SECTION 4.

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Said title is further amended in Code Section 16-11-129, relating to weapons carry license, gun safety information, temporary renewal permit, mandamus, and verification of license, by revising subparagraph (a)(2)(A) as follows:

"(A) As used in this paragraph, the term 'service member' means an active duty member of the regular or reserve component of the United States Army, United States Navy, United States Marine Corps, United States Coast Guard, United States Air Force, United States Space Force, United States National Guard, Georgia Army National Guard, or Georgia Air National Guard."

52 SECTION 5.

Title 19 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to domestic relations, is amended in Code Section 19-7-5, relating to reporting of child abuse, when mandated or authorized, content of report, to whom made, immunity from liability, report based upon privileged communication, penalty for failure to report, and spiritual treatment for illnesses, by revising subparagraph (e)(1)(B) as follows:

"(B) 'Armed forces of the United States' or 'military' means the United States Army, United States Navy, United States Marine Corps, United States Coast Guard, United States Air Force, <u>United States Space Force</u>, United States National Guard, Georgia Army National Guard, or Georgia Air National Guard, or a reserve component thereof."

62	SECTION 6.
63	Said title is further amended in Code Section 19-8-26, relating to forms, by revising
64	subparagraph (h)(2)(A) as follows:
65	"(A) The branch of his service is (Army) (Navy) (Marine) (Air Force) (Space Force)
66	(Coast Guard) [circle one]."

67	SECTION 7.
68	Said title is further amended in Code Section 19-8-26, relating to forms, by revising
69	subparagraph (n)(7)(A) as follows:
70	"(A) The branch of my service is (Army)(Navy)(Marine)(Airforce)(Space Force)(Coast
71	Guard)[circle one]."
72	SECTION 8.
73	Said title is further amended in Code Section 19-9-6, relating to definitions relative to child
74	custody proceedings, by revising paragraph (1) of subsection (a) as follows:
75	"(1) 'Armed forces' means the national guard and the reserve components of the armed
76	forces, the United States army, navy, marine corps, space force, coast guard, and air
77	force."
78	SECTION 9.
79	Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to education, is amended in
80	Code Section 20-4-130, relating to definitions relative to the Defense Community Economic
81	Development Grant Program, by revising paragraph (4) of subsection (a) as follows:
82	"(4) 'Military installation' means a facility owned and operated by United States Army,
83	Air Force, Navy, Marines, Space Force, or Coast Guard that shelters military equipment
84	and personnel and facilitates training and operations for such organizations."
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85 **SECTION 10.** 

86 Chapter 2 of Title 38 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to military affairs,

- 87 is amended in Code Section 38-2-2, relating to definitions relative to the Defense Community
- 88 Economic Development Grant Program, by revising paragraph (4) of subsection (a) as
- 89 follows:
- 90 "(1) 'Active military service of the United States' and 'in the armed forces of the United
- States' mean full-time duty in the army, navy, marine corps, air force, space force, or
- oast guard of the United States."

93 **SECTION 11.** 

- 94 Said chapter is further amended in Code Section 38-2-217, relating to resignations, acts
- 95 constituting resignation, types of discharge after resignation, and resignation of officers who
- are accountable for military funds or property, by revising subsection (b) as follows:
- 97 "(b) Enlistment in the regular army, air force, navy, marine corps, space force, or coast
- guard of the United States shall be deemed a resignation by the person so enlisting of all
- 99 commissions in the militia held by him or her."

100 **SECTION 12.** 

- 101 Chapter 2 of Title 40, relating to registration and licensing of motor vehicles, is amended in
- 102 Code Section 40-2-65, relating to special license plates for members of active reserve
- 103 components of the United States, by revising paragraph (1) of subsection (a) as follows:
- 104 "(1) Motor vehicle owners who are assigned or attached members of troop program units
- of any branch of the active reserve components of the United States inside or outside the
- State of Georgia shall be eligible to receive free motor vehicle license plates for private
- passenger cars, motorcycles, or trucks used for personal transportation. Motor vehicle
- owners who are members of any National Guard unit in a state adjoining the State of
- Georgia and for whom there is no National Guard unit in the county of their residence

shall be eligible to receive free motor vehicle plates for private passenger cars, motorcycles, or trucks used for personal transportation to identify such vehicle owner as a reservist. Such license plates shall be issued in compliance with the state motor vehicle laws relating to registration and licensing of motor vehicles as prescribed in Article 2 of this chapter. No person shall be entitled to more than one free motor vehicle license plate for any calendar year; provided, however, that, upon payment of the regular license fee provided for in Code Section 40-2-151 and a manufacturing fee of \$25.00, a reservist shall be entitled to receive one additional such license plate. For each additional license plate for which an initial \$25.00 fee was required, there shall be an additional annual registration fee of \$25.00, which fee shall be collected by the county tag agent at the time of collection of other registration fees and shall be remitted to the state as provided in Code Section 40-2-34. Additional words or symbols in addition to numbers and letters prescribed by law shall be inscribed upon such license plates so as to identify distinctively the owner as a member of one of the following branches of the United States military reserve: Army, Navy, Marines, Air Force, Space Force, or Coast Guard. The commanding officer of each active reserve component program unit or the adjutant general of the National Guard unit of each neighboring state shall, upon request of any reserve member or National Guard member of that unit, respectively, furnish to that member approved documentation supporting the member's current membership in the respective reserve or National Guard unit. This documentation shall be presented annually to the tax commissioner of the county in which the reserve member or National Guard member applies for the special license plate under this Code section and upon subsequent reregistration for each succeeding year."

133 **SECTION 13.** 

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Said chapter is further amended in Code Section 40-2-85.1, relating to special license plates for certain veterans, by revising subsection (d) as follows:

"(d) The special and distinctive vehicle license plates shall be as prescribed in Article 2 of this chapter for private passenger cars, motorcycles, trucks, recreational vehicles, and trailers used for personal transportation. Such plates shall contain words or symbols, in addition to the numbers and letters prescribed by law, so as to identify distinctively the owners who are veterans, who are recipients of a military medal award, or who served during active military combat and shall additionally identify distinctively the owner as a current or former member of one of the following branches of the armed forces of the United States: Army, Navy, Marines, Air Force, Space Force, or Coast Guard."

**SECTION 14.** 

Title 47 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to retirement and pensions, is amended in Code Section 47-1-60, relating to definitions relative to establishing creditable service by veterans, by revising paragraph (5) of subsection (a) as follows:

"(5) 'Uniformed services' means the United States Army, Army Reserve, Army National Guard, Navy, Navy Reserve, Marine Corps, Marine Corps Reserve, Air Force, Air Force Reserve, Space Force, Space Force Reserve, Air National Guard, Coast Guard, the commissioned corps of the Public Health Service, and any other category of persons designated by the President of the United States in time of war or emergency."

**SECTION 15.** 

Said title is further amended in of Code Section 47-7-88, relating to impact of active duty military service upon receipt of creditable service time, by revising subsection (a) as follows:

"(a) The provisions of this Code section apply solely to any member of the fund who left active employment as a firefighter as a result of being called to active duty as a member of the Army or Air Force National Guard or the Army Reserve, Air Force Reserve, Navy Reserve, Space Force Reserve, or Marine Corps Reserve and who returned to employment as a firefighter upon being released from such active duty."

161	SECTION 16.
162	Said title is further amended by revising Code Section 47-24-81, relating to transfer of
163	service credits, as follows:
164	"47-24-81.
165	In addition to the creditable service allowed pursuant to Code Section 47-24-80, any
166	member shall receive creditable service for any past service as a member of the United
167	States Army, Army Reserve, Army National Guard, Navy, Navy Reserve, Marine Corps,
168	Marine Corps Reserve, Air Force, Air Force Reserve, Space Force, Space Force Reserve,
169	Air National Guard, or Coast Guard if such service meets the same requirement for
170	creditable time served as set forth for nonregular service retirement under Chapter 67 of
171	Title 10 of the United States Code."

172 **SECTION 17.** 

173 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
