## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Part 3 of Article 4 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 2 Annotated, relating to carrying and possession of firearms, so as to provide for the offense
- 3 of unlawfully carrying a weapon into a secure airport area; to provide for related matters; to
- 4 provide for an effective date and applicability; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 5 purposes.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Part 3 of Article 4 of Chapter 11 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 9 relating to carrying and possession of firearms, is amended by adding a new Code section to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 "<u>16-11-127.3</u>
- 12 (a) No person shall enter the restricted access area of a commercial service airport, in or
- beyond the airport security screening checkpoint, knowingly possessing or knowingly
- 14 <u>having under his or her control a weapon or long gun. This area shall not include an airport</u>
- drive, general parking area, walkway, or shops and areas of the terminal that are outside
- the screening checkpoint and that are normally open to unscreened passengers or visitors
- 17 <u>to the airport. Any restricted access area shall be clearly indicated by prominent signs</u>
- indicating that firearms and other weapons are prohibited in the area.
- 19 (b) A person who violates the provisions of subsection (a) of this Code section shall be
- 20 guilty of a misdemeanor offense; provided, however, a person who violates subsection (a)
- with the intent to commit a separate felony offense shall be guilty of a felony and, upon
- 22 conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$1,000.00 nor more than
- 23 \$15,000.00 or by imprisonment for not less than one nor more than ten years, or both."

- 25 This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2013, and shall apply to offenses committed on
- or after such date.

SECTION 3.

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
