A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Code Section 26-4-80 and Chapter 17 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 2 Annotated, relating to prescription drug orders and control of venereal disease, respectively,
- 3 so as to provide for expedited partner therapy for patients with chlamydia or gonorrhea; to
- 4 provide for definitions; to revise provisions relating to dispensing prescription drugs; to
- 5 provide for immunity; to provide for rules and regulations; to provide for related matters; to
- 6 repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Code Section 26-4-80 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to prescription
- 10 drug orders, is amended by revising paragraph (2) of subsection (c) as follows:
- 11 "(2) Prescription drug orders transmitted by facsimile or computer shall include:
- 12 (A) In the case of a prescription drug order for a dangerous drug, the complete name
- and address of the practitioner;

- 14 (B) In the case of a prescription drug order for a controlled substance, the complete
- name, address, and DEA registration number of the practitioner;
- 16 (C) The telephone number of the practitioner for verbal confirmation;
- 17 (D) The name and address of the patient, unless the prescription drug order is
- prescribed pursuant to expedited partner therapy in accordance with Code Section
- 19 <u>31-17-7.1 for use by a sexual partner of a patient clinically diagnosed with chlamydia</u>
- 20 <u>or gonorrhea, in which case, the name and address of such sexual partner of the patient;</u>
- 21 (E) The time and date of the transmission;
- 22 (F) The full name of the person transmitting the order; and
- 23 (G) The signature of the practitioner in a manner as defined in regulations promulgated
- by the board or, in the case of a controlled substances prescription, in accordance with
- 25 21 C.F.R. 1301.22;"

26 SECTION 2.

27 Chapter 17 of Title 31 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to control of

- venereal disease, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 29 "31-17-7.1.
- 30 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- 31 (1) 'Expedited partner therapy' means the practice of prescribing, ordering, or dispensing
- 32 <u>antibiotic drugs to the sexual partner or partners of a patient clinically diagnosed with</u>
- 33 <u>chlamydia or gonorrhea without physical examination of such partner or partners.</u>
- 34 (2) 'Licensed practitioner' means a physician licensed to practice medicine in this state,
- 35 <u>an advanced practice registered nurse or physician assistant acting pursuant to delegated</u>
- authority by a physician in accordance with Code Section 43-34-23 or 43-34-25 or
- 37 <u>subsection (e.1) of Code Section 43-34-103, or a registered professional nurse employed</u>
- 38 <u>by the department or a county board of health.</u>
- 39 (b) A licensed practitioner who diagnoses a patient to be infected with chlamydia or
- 40 gonorrhea may utilize expedited partner therapy in accordance with any rules and
- 41 <u>regulations established by the department for the management of the health of such</u>
- 42 <u>patient's sexual partner or partners.</u>
- 43 (c) Any licensed practitioner who, reasonably and in good faith, prescribes antibiotic drugs
- 44 for expedited partner therapy in accordance with this Code section and any rules and
- 45 regulations established by the department shall not be subject to civil or criminal liability
- and shall not be deemed to have engaged in unprofessional conduct by such practitioner's
- 47 <u>licensing board.</u>
- 48 (d) Any pharmacist licensed in this state who, reasonably and in good faith, dispenses
- 49 <u>antibiotic drugs pursuant to a prescription for expedited partner therapy in accordance with</u>
- 50 this Code section and any rules and regulations established by the department shall not be
- 51 <u>subject to civil or criminal liability and shall not be deemed to have engaged in</u>
- 52 <u>unprofessional conduct by the State Board of Pharmacy.</u>
- 53 (e) The department shall be authorized to promulgate rules and regulations to implement
- 54 the provisions of this Code section."

56 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
