A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 14 of Title 10 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 cemetery and funeral services, so as to provide additional time under certain circumstances
- 3 for purchasers of burial lots, burial rights, burial merchandise, and burial services to pursue
- 4 a civil cause of action against sellers that violate certain laws; to provide for a short title; to
- 5 provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and
- 6 for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

9 This Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Burial Purchaser Protection Act."

SECTION 2.

- 11 Chapter 14 of Title 10 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to cemetery and
- 12 funeral services, is amended by revising Code Section 10-14-21, relating to purchaser's
- 13 remedy for violations, as follows:

- 14 "10-14-21.
- 15 (a) Any person who violates any provision of subsection (a) of Code Section 10-14-17
- shall be liable to the person buying such burial lot, burial right, burial merchandise, or
- burial service services; and such buyer may bring action in any court of competent
- jurisdiction to recover the consideration paid in cash for the burial lot, burial right, burial
- merchandise, or burial service services together with interest at the legal rate from the date
- of such payment, and reasonable attorney's fees and costs.
- 21 (b) In addition to the remedy set forth in subsection (a) of this Code section, a purchaser
- 22 may apply to a court of competent jurisdiction in this state for an order authorizing the
- 23 recovery of the preneed escrow deposit if a registrant fails to deliver burial merchandise
- or perform preneed burial services in accordance with the terms of the preneed sales
- 25 contract.
- 26 (c) No person may bring action under this Code section more than two years from the date
- 27 of the scheduled completion of the contract for sale or from the date of the sale if there is
- 28 no contract for sale A cause of action under this Code section shall be brought within two
- years from the date of the sale, whether or not pursuant to a written contract; provided,
- 30 however, that as to the sale of a burial lot, burial right, burial merchandise, or burial
- services, a cause of action of under this Code section shall be brought within two years
- from the date of the completion of such sale or within two years after the request for the
- use of such burial lot, burial right, burial merchandise, or burial services, whichever is later.
- 34 (d) Every cause of action under this chapter survives the death of any person who might
- 35 have been a plaintiff or defendant.
- 36 (e) Nothing in this chapter shall limit any statutory or common-law right of any person in
- any court for any act involving the sale of a burial lot, burial right, burial merchandise, or
- 38 burial services."

- 43 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
