## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 7 of Chapter 3 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to scholarships, loans, and grants for postsecondary education, so as to establish the
- 3 Realizing Educational Achievement Can Happen (REACH) Scholarship Program; to provide
- 4 for a short title; to provide for definitions; to provide for scholarship eligibility and
- 5 requirements; to provide for participation of local school systems; to provide for continuing
- 6 eligibility; to provide for funding; to provide for rules and regulations; to provide for related
- 7 matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

9 **SECTION 1.** 

- 10 Article 7 of Chapter 3 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- scholarships, loans, and grants for postsecondary education, is amended by adding a new part
- 12 to read as follows:
- 13 "<u>Part 4</u>
- 14 <u>20-3-495.</u>
- 15 This part shall be known and may be cited as the 'Realizing Educational Achievement Can
- 16 <u>Happen (REACH) Scholarship Act.'</u>
- 17 <u>20-3-496.</u>
- 18 As used in this part, the term:
- 19 (1) 'Realizing Educational Achievement Can Happen (REACH) Scholarship Program'
- 20 <u>or 'scholarship program' means the needs-based mentoring and scholarship program</u>
- 21 <u>established pursuant to this part to provide promising students the support to graduate</u>
- from high school and achieve postsecondary educational success.
- 23 (2) 'REACH participating school system' means a local school system that meets the
- 24 <u>requirements of Code Section 20-3-498.</u>

25 (3) 'REACH scholar' means a student in a REACH participating school system who has

- been nominated and approved to participate in the scholarship program.
- 27 <u>20-3-497.</u>
- 28 (a) The Realizing Educational Achievement Can Happen (REACH) Scholarship Program
- 29 <u>is hereby established. The scholarship program shall provide scholarships and support to</u>
- 30 <u>eligible students who meet the following requirements:</u>
- 31 (1) Be a United States citizen or an eligible noncitizen for 12 consecutive months prior
- 32 to the first day of classes of the spring term of the student's 7th grade school year;
- 33 (2) Be enrolled in a REACH participating school system;
- 34 (3) Qualify for the federal free or reduced lunch program;
- 35 (4) Not have had more than two in-school suspensions during the two semesters or four
- 36 quarters immediately preceding the spring term of the student's seventh grade year;
- 37 (5) Not have any criminal or drug-related convictions;
- 38 (6) Not have more than five days of unexcused absences during any of the student's
- 39 <u>middle school calendar years;</u>
- 40 (7) Have his or her parents or guardians complete and submit a release of information
- form, as part of the application process, authorizing the school to provide the authority
- 42 <u>information related to the student's participation in the program; and</u>
- 43 (8) Demonstrate academic promise, as defined by the authority, taking into consideration
- 44 grades, attendance, and behavior.
- 45 <u>20-3-498.</u>
- 46 <u>Local school systems interested in becoming a REACH participating school system shall</u>
- 47 <u>complete the REACH Scholarship Program application, and provide detailed descriptions</u>
- of how program requirements will be met, including, but not limited to how the local
- 49 <u>school system will:</u>
- 50 (1) Identify the REACH coordinator;
- 51 (2) Establish a mentor program or utilize an existing local program;
- 52 (3) Identify the academic coach to monitor REACH scholars' academics, behavior, and
- attendance, as well as their transition from middle school to high school; and
- 54 (4) Develop plans to engage the community and sustain the program financially and
- 55 <u>programmatically.</u>
- 56 <u>20-3-499.</u>
- 57 (a) REACH participating school systems shall select each student for the program in the
- 58 spring of the student's seventh grade year or in the fall of his or her eighth grade year, for

59 participation beginning in the eighth grade year. REACH participating school systems

- 60 <u>shall develop a rigorous application process to select REACH scholars, including but not</u>
- 61 <u>limited to:</u>
- 62 (1) Identifying all students eligible for federal free or reduced price lunch;
- 63 (2) Nominating qualified students to apply. Nominations can be made by counselors,
- 64 principals, superintendents, or any individual within the REACH participating school
- 65 system who is able to identify students most in need of the REACH scholarship;
- 66 (3) Requiring nominated students to complete the REACH student application, which
- includes an academic recommendation and a community recommendation;
- 68 (4) Reviewing student packets, including the nomination form, proof of eligibility for
- 69 <u>federal free or reduced lunch, citizenship and residency requirements, and grade,</u>
- 70 <u>attendance, and discipline reports; and</u>
- 71 (5) Interviewing all nominated students by a student selection committee established by
- 72 <u>the REACH participating school system.</u>
- 73 (b) REACH participating school systems shall be eligible to designate the following
- number of REACH scholars:
- 75 (1) For school systems with five or more high schools, 12 REACH scholars; and
- 76 (2) For school systems with less than five high schools, seven REACH scholars.
- 77 <u>20-3-499.1.</u>
- 78 (a) To maintain eligibility during middle school and high school, a REACH scholar shall:
- 79 (1)(A) Maintain a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.5 or better as calculated
- 80 by the REACH participating school system, if the REACH scholar is in middle school;
- 81 <u>or</u>
- 82 (B) Maintain a secondary cumulative grade point average of at least 2.5 as calculated
- by the authority in the same manner as the high school grade point average for initial
- 84 <u>HOPE scholarship eligibility;</u>
- 85 (2) Adhere to the REACH participating school system's stated attendance policy and
- 86 <u>attend classes regularly. A REACH scholar will be placed on probation for one semester</u>
- 87 <u>after reaching five or more combined excused and unexcused absences in one semester.</u>
- While on probation, the REACH scholar may be removed from the program if he or she
- 89 <u>has any additional unexcused absences or three or more excused absences;</u>
- 90 (3) Adhere to the REACH participating school system's stated disciplinary policy. A
- 91 REACH Scholar will be placed on probation for one semester if he or she receives more
- 92 <u>than one in-school suspension per semester or immediately upon an out-of-school</u>
- 93 <u>suspension</u>. While on probation, the REACH scholar may be removed from the program
- 94 <u>if he or she has an additional suspension;</u>

95 (4) Remain drug and alcohol-free. A REACH scholar convicted of committing a felony

- or misdemeanor involving marijuana, controlled substances, or dangerous drugs, is
- 97 <u>immediately ineligible for further participation in the scholarship program. A REACH</u>
- 98 scholar who fails to comply with the REACH participating school system's drug and
- 99 <u>alcohol policies will be immediately ineligible for further participation in the scholarship</u>
- 100 <u>program;</u>
- 101 (5) Meet with his or her assigned REACH mentor a minimum of eight times per
- semester;
- 103 (6) Meet with his or her assigned REACH academic coach a minimum of four times per
- 104 <u>semester;</u>
- 105 (7) Attend REACH program activities;
- 106 (8) Graduate from high school; and
- (9) Enroll in a University System of Georgia or Technical College System of Georgia
- institution or an eligible private postsecondary educational institution.
- (b) To maintain eligibility during college, a REACH scholar shall:
- (1) Be enrolled full-time at an eligible postsecondary institution;
- (2) Maintain a minimum 2.0 grade point average and satisfactory academic progress, as
- determined by the authority;
- (3) Complete and submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) each year
- of college; and
- 115 (4) Not be in default on a federal or state educational loan or owe a refund to a federal
- or state student financial aid program.
- 117 <u>20-3-499.2.</u>
- (a) Subject to available funding, the authority will provide \$10,000.00 for each REACH
- scholar for the first year of the REACH participating school system's participation in the
- scholarship program.
- (b) Each year thereafter, the REACH participating school system will be responsible for
- providing a proportionate share of the scholarship. The REACH participating school
- system's proportionate share shall be based on the school system's designated tier in the
- 124 <u>Department of Community Affairs' job tax credit designation.</u>

- The authority shall develop rules, guidelines, application forms, and application procedures
- necessary to implement the provisions of this part."
