A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Part 1 of Article 2 of Chapter 7 of Title 16 and Chapter 60 of Title 36 of the
- 2 Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general provisions relative to criminal
- 3 trespass and damage to property and general provisions relative to provisions applicable to
- 4 counties and municipal corporations, respectively, so as to provide for peace officers to serve
- 5 as authorized representatives of a property owner or rightful occupant in certain instances
- 6 relating to the enforcement of criminal trespass; to authorize the establishment of trespass
- 7 enforcement programs by governing authorities of counties and municipal corporations; to
- 8 provide for program standards; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and
- 9 for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

- 12 Part 1 of Article 2 of Chapter 7 of Title 16 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 13 relating to general provisions relative to criminal trespass and damage to property, is
- amended in Code Section 16-7-21, relating to criminal trespass, by revising subsection (c)
- 15 as follows:

16 "(c) For the purposes of subsection (b) of this Code section, permission:

(1) Permission to enter or invitation to enter given by a minor who is or is not present on or in the property of the minor's parent or guardian is not sufficient to allow lawful entry of another person upon the land, premises, vehicle, railroad car, aircraft, or watercraft owned or rightfully occupied by such minor's parent or guardian if such parent or guardian has previously given notice that such entry is forbidden or notice to depart; and (2) An authorized representative shall include a peace officer with authority to enforce this Code section when the owner or rightful occupant has executed proper documentation for participation in a local trespass enforcement program pursuant to Code Section 36-60-30 and a 'no trespassing' sign is displayed prominently on the property."

26 SECTION 2.

Chapter 60 of Title 36 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general provisions relative to provisions applicable to counties and municipal corporations, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:

30 "36-60-30.

The governing authority of any county and municipal corporation shall be authorized to establish a trespass enforcement program on behalf of any law enforcement agency under the control of such governing authority. Such program shall provide any participating owner or rightful occupant of property with a method for designating any peace officer with the local law enforcement agency as his or her authorized representative for purposes of enforcing criminal trespass in violation of Code Section 16-7-21. Any governing authority that establishes a trespass enforcement program shall require submission of an attestation by the applicant that he or she is the owner or rightful occupant of the property and that such person will cooperate with such local law enforcement agency for purposes of the prosecution of persons arrested upon the participating property. Such authorization shall be limited to one-year increments. Participation in any trespass enforcement program shall be limited to owners or rightful occupants of commercial property; provided,

- however, that participation by owners of residential property with multiple units shall be
- 44 <u>authorized for common use areas of such property."</u>

45 SECTION 3.

46 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
