A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to professions and
- 2 businesses, so as to provide for reciprocal licensing of professions, occupations, and trades
- 3 for individuals licensed outside of the State of Georgia; to provide for definitions; to provide
- 4 for exceptions; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other
- 5 purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to professions and businesses,
- 9 is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 10 "43-1-35.
- 11 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- 12 (1) 'License' means a document, permit, certificate of registration, or other authorization
- that is required for an individual to engage in a profession, occupation, or trade.
- 14 (2) 'Regulating entity' means a board, agency, or other entity that issues a license on
- behalf of a state, country, or province or other such subdivision within a country.
- 16 (3) 'Relocating military spouse' means a spouse of a service member accompanying such
- 17 <u>service member to an official permanent change of station to a military installation</u>
- 18 <u>located in this state.</u>
- 19 (4) 'Service member' means an active duty member of the United States armed forces,
- 20 <u>including the National Guard.</u>
- 21 (5) 'State' means a state of the United States or the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the
- 22 <u>United States Virgin Islands, or any territory or insular possession subject to the</u>
- 23 <u>jurisdiction of the United States.</u>
- 24 (b) Notwithstanding any other law, a license shall be issued in the discipline applied for
- 25 and for the same scope of practice as determined by the respective regulating entity to an

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26 <u>individual who is a resident of this state or who is a relocating military spouse, if such</u>

- 27 <u>individual:</u>
- 28 (1) Is currently licensed in at least one other state, country, or province or other such
- 29 <u>subdivision thereof in the discipline applied for and for the same scope of practice as</u>
- determined by the regulating entity and the license is in good standing in all states,
- 31 countries, and provinces or other such subdivisions thereof in which the person holds a
- 32 <u>license in such discipline;</u>
- 33 (2) Has been licensed in such discipline for at least one year;
- 34 (3) Was licensed by a regulating entity outside of this state when there were minimum
- 35 <u>education requirements and, if applicable, work experience and clinical supervision</u>
- 36 requirements in effect and such regulating entity verifies that the individual met those
- 37 <u>requirements in order to be licensed by such regulating entity;</u>
- 38 (4) Previously passed an examination required for the license, if required by the
- 39 <u>regulating entity outside of this state;</u>
- 40 (5) Has not had a license revoked;
- 41 (6) Has not voluntarily surrendered a license or certificate issued by a regulating entity
- 42 <u>outside of this state while under investigation for unprofessional conduct;</u>
- 43 (7) Has not had disciplinary action relating to unprofessional conduct imposed by any
- 44 regulating entity. If another jurisdiction has taken disciplinary action against the person,
- 45 <u>the regulating entity in this state shall determine if the cause for the action was corrected</u>
- and the matter resolved. If the matter has not been resolved by that jurisdiction, the
- 47 <u>regulating entity in this state may not issue or deny a license until the matter is resolved;</u>
- 48 (8) Does not have a complaint, allegation, or investigation pending before a regulating
- 49 <u>entity outside of this state that relates to unprofessional conduct. If an applicant has a</u>
- 50 complaint, allegation, or investigation pending, the regulating entity in this state shall
- 51 <u>suspend the application process and may not issue or deny a license to the applicant until</u>
- 52 <u>the complaint, allegation, or investigation is resolved;</u>
- 53 (9) Does not have a disqualifying criminal history as determined by the regulating entity
- 54 <u>in this state; and</u>
- 55 (10) Pays all applicable fees.
- 56 (c) Nothing in this Code section shall prevent a regulating entity in this state from entering
- 57 <u>into a licensing compact or reciprocity agreement with another state, country, or province</u>
- or other such subdivision thereof.
- 59 (d) A regulating entity that administers an examination on the law of this state as part of
- 60 <u>its license application requirement may require an applicant to take and pass an</u>
- 61 <u>examination specific to the laws of the State of Georgia prior to issuing a license pursuant</u>

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62 <u>to this Code section. This subsection shall not be applicable to relocating military spouses</u>

- as such individuals shall not be required to pass such an examination.
- 64 (e) An individual who is licensed in this state pursuant to this Code section shall be subject
- 65 to the laws regulating such individual's practice in this state and shall be subject to the
- 66 <u>jurisdiction of the regulating entity in this state.</u>
- 67 (f) This Code section shall not apply to:
- 68 (1) Criteria for a license that is issued pursuant to a license of eligibility that is
- 69 <u>established by an interstate compact; or</u>
- 70 (2) The ability of a regulating entity in this state to require an applicant to submit
- 71 <u>fingerprints to allow for a federal and state criminal records information check.</u>
- 72 (g) A license issued pursuant to this Code section shall be valid only in this state and shall
- not make the licensed individual eligible to be part of an interstate compact. A regulating
- entity in this state may determine eligibility for an applicant to be licensed pursuant to this
- 75 Code section if the applicant is not part of an interstate compact."

76 SECTION 2.

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
