A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to motor vehicles and
- 2 traffic, so as to provide for increased access to government issued identification and driving
- 3 authorization to state residents through the issuance of state driving cards and identification
- 4 cards; to provide for a short title; to revise a definition; to provide for an exception to the
- 5 requirement that the Department of Driver Services utilize a certain federal verification
- 6 program; to provide for application requirements for such driving cards and identification
- 7 cards; to provide for standards for the appearance of such cards; to provide for fees for
- 8 issuance and renewal of such cards; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws;
- 9 and for other purposes.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

SECTION 1.

12 This act shall be known as and may be cited as the "Freedom to Drive Act."

13 **SECTION 2.** 14 Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to motor vehicles and traffic, is amended in Code Section 40-1-1, relating to definitions, by revising paragraph (24) as 15 16 follows: 17 "(24) 'License' or 'license to operate a motor vehicle' means any driver's license or any 18 other license or permit to operate a motor vehicle issued under, or granted by, the laws 19 of this state, including: 20 (A) Any temporary license or instruction permit; 21 (B) The privilege of any person to drive a motor vehicle whether or not such person 22 holds a valid license; and 23 (C) Any nonresident's operating privilege as defined in this Code section; and 24 (D) Any driving card issued pursuant to Code Section 40-5-21.3, except where the 25 term license is used in Chapter 5 of this title relative to the issuance, expiration, and 26 renewal of a license issued in compliance with the federal Real ID Act."

SECTION 3.

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Said title is further amended in Code Section 40-5-2, relating to keeping of records of applications for licenses and information on licensees, and furnishing of information, by revising subparagraphs (c)(1)(D) and (c)(1)(G), subsection (e), the introductory language of subsection (f), and subsection (f) as follows:

"(D) To a judge, prosecuting official, or law enforcement agency for use in investigations or prosecutions of alleged criminal or unlawful activity, or to the driver's licensing agency of another state; provided, however, that any documents and information collected in connection with an application for a driving card under Code Section 40-5-21.3 or an identification card under Code Section 40-5-100.1, including the fact of such application, shall not be furnished by the department except upon issuance of a court order issued by a federal court of competent jurisdiction;"

"(G) For use in the normal course of business by a legitimate business or its agents,employees, or contractors, but only:

- (i) To verify the accuracy of personal information submitted by the individual to the business or its agents, employees, or contractors; and
- (ii) If such information as so submitted is not correct or is no longer correct, to obtain the correct information, but only for the purposes of preventing fraud by, pursuing legal remedies against, or recovering on a debt or security interest against, the individual;

provided, however, that any documents and information collected in connection with an application for a driving card under Code Section 40-5-21.3 or an identification card under Code Section 40-5-100.1, including the fact of such application, shall not be furnished by the department except upon issuance of a court order issued by a federal court of competent jurisdiction; and further provided, that notwithstanding the definition of personal information under Code Section 40-5-1, personal information furnished under this subparagraph shall be limited to name, address, and driver identification number and shall not include photographs, fingerprints, computer images, or medical or disability information. The personal information obtained by a business under this subparagraph shall not be resold or redisclosed for any other purpose without the written consent of the individual. Furnishing of information to a business under this subparagraph shall be pursuant to a contract entered into by such business and the state which specifies, without limitation, the consideration to be paid by such business to the state for such information and the frequency of updates."

"(e) Except as otherwise provided to the contrary in Code Sections 40-5-21.3 and 40-5-100.1, upon Upon written request, the department may provide copies of any record or personal information from any driver's record for use by any appropriate governmental official, entity, or agency for the purposes of carrying out official governmental functions or legitimate governmental duties; provided, however, that notwithstanding the definition

of personal information under Code Section 40-5-1, personal information furnished under

- 67 this subsection shall be limited to name, address, driver identification number, and medical
- or disability information.
- 69 (f) Except for any documents and information collected in connection with an application
- for a driving card under Code Section 40-5-21.3 or an identification card under Code
- 71 <u>Section 40-5-100.1 the</u> The department is specifically authorized to disseminate the
- 72 following records and information:"
- 73 "(i) The provisions of this Code section shall apply, where relevant, to the maintenance and

77 SECTION 4.

- 78 Said title is further amended by revising Code Section 40-5-21.1, relating to temporary
- 79 licenses, permits, or special identification cards, foreign licenses as evidence of legal
- 80 presence in the United States, and extensions, as follows:
- 81 "40-5-21.1.
- 82 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this title, an applicant who presents in person
- valid documentary evidence of:
- 84 (1) Admission to the United States in a valid, unexpired nonimmigrant status;
- 85 (2) A pending or approved application for asylum in the United States;
- 86 (3) Admission into the United States in refugee status;
- 87 (4) An approved application for temporary protected status in the United States;
- 88 (5) Approved deferred action status;
- 89 (6) Other federal documentation verified by the United States Department of Homeland
- 90 Security to be valid documentary evidence of lawful presence in the United States under
- 91 federal immigration law; or

(7) Verification of lawful presence as provided by Code Section 40-5-21.2 may be issued a temporary license, permit, or special identification card. Such temporary license, permit, or special identification card shall be valid only during the period of time of the applicant's authorized stay in the United States or <u>five eight</u> years, whichever occurs first.

(b) A driver's license or identification card issued by any state or territory which, on or after July 1, 2006, authorized such driver's license or identification card to be issued to persons not lawfully present in the United States may not be accepted as evidence of legal presence in the United States.

(c) Any noncitizen applicant whose Georgia driver's license or identification card <u>issued</u> pursuant to the authority of this Code section has expired, or will expire within 30 days, who has filed, or on whose behalf has been filed, a request for an extension with the United States Department of Homeland Security, or similar such federal issuing agency, for time to remain lawfully within the United States shall be issued a temporary driving permit or identification card valid for 120 days from the date of the expiration of his or her valid driver's license or identification card. The noncitizen applicant shall be required to present evidence of the application for extension by submitting a copy or copies of documentation designated by the department. A temporary driving permit or identification card shall be issued upon submission of the required documentation and an application fee in an amount to be determined by the department. Upon the expiration of the temporary driving permit or identification card, no further consecutive temporary permits or identification cards shall be authorized; provided, however, <u>that</u> application may be made following the expiration of an additional valid Georgia driver's license or identification card."

SECTION 5.

Said title is further amended in Code Section 40-5-21.2, relating to compliance with Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements Program, application, and implementation, by adding a new subsection to read as follows:

"(e) This Code section shall not apply to applications for driving cards issued pursuant to
 Code Section 40-5-21.3."

(e) An identification card issued pursuant to this Code section shall not be used as 438 439 evidence of the holder's citizenship or immigration status and shall not be used as a basis for a criminal investigation, arrest, or detention in any instance when a person with an 440 441 identification card not issued under this Code section would not be criminally investigated, 442 arrested, or detained. 443 (f) Any portion of any record retained by the department relating to an application for an 444 identification card that contains a photographic image or identifies the social security 445 number, telephone number, place of birth, country of origin, place of employment, address, school or educational institution attended, source of income, status as a recipient of public 446 447 benefits, customer identification number associated with a public utilities account, or medical or disability related information shall not be a public record, shall be exempt from 448 449 disclosure under the provisions of Article 4 of Chapter 18 of Title 50, and shall not be 450 disclosed except to the person who is the subject of the record, where otherwise expressly 451 required under 49 U.S.C.S. Section 30305, or where necessary to comply with a lawful 452 court order or judicial warrant by a federal court of competent jurisdiction. 453 (g)(1) No person may possess more than one identification card issued pursuant to this 454 Code section; provided, however, that this subsection shall not be construed to prevent 455 a person issued a driver's license, instruction permit, or limited driving permit pursuant 456 to this title from also possessing an identification card issued under this article. 457 (2)(A) Any person who applies for an identification card shall indicate on such 458 application whether he or she is in possession of any other valid identification card, 459 driver's license, instruction permit, or limited driving permit issued pursuant to this title 460 or by any other jurisdiction.

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(B) Except as provided in paragraph (3) of this subsection, each applicant for an identification card shall surrender to the department any valid identification card, driver's license, instruction permit, or limited driving permit previously issued pursuant to this title or by any other jurisdiction. The department shall physically mark any surrendered identification card, driver's license, instruction permit, or limited driving permit in a manner which makes it apparent that such card, license, or permit is no longer valid and return the card, license, or permit to such person. (C) The department shall issue a receipt to a person eligible to be issued an identification card pursuant to the requirements of this title. Such receipt may be used as proof of issuance until the person has received his or her permanent identification card. (D) If a surrendered identification card, driver's license, instruction permit, or limited driving permit was issued by another jurisdiction, the department shall forward the surrendered card, license, or permit information to the previous jurisdiction. (3)(A) Any noncitizen who is eligible for issuance of an identification card pursuant to the requirements of this title and is in possession of an identification card or driver's license issued by a foreign jurisdiction may be issued an identification card without surrendering the foreign driver's license or identification card. This exemption shall not apply to a person who is required to terminate any previously issued identification card pursuant to federal law. (B) The department shall make a notation on the driving record of any person who retains a foreign identification card or driver's license, and this information shall be made available to law enforcement officers and agencies on such person's driving record through the Georgia Crime Information Center. (h) Any person who has been refused an identification card by the department may make a request in writing for a hearing to be provided by the department. Such hearing shall be provided by the department within 30 days after the receipt of such request and shall follow

SECTION 9.

491 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
