A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Part 3 of Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia
- 2 Annotated, relating to elementary and secondary educational programs, so as to provide for
- 3 the issuance of a seal of biliteracy for high school graduates who have achieved a high level
- 4 of proficiency in speaking, reading, and writing one or more languages in addition to
- 5 English; to provide for criteria; to provide for participation; to provide for related matters;
- 6 to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Part 3 of Article 6 of Chapter 2 of Title 20 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 10 relating to elementary and secondary educational programs, is amended by adding a new
- 11 Code section to read as follows:
- 12 "<u>20-2-159.5.</u>
- 13 (a) There is established a Georgia Seal of Biliteracy to recognize high school graduates
- 14 who have attained a high level of proficiency in speaking, reading, and writing one or more
- 15 <u>languages in addition to English.</u>
- 16 (b) The purposes of the Georgia Seal of Biliteracy are as follows:
- 17 (1) To encourage pupils to study foreign languages;
- 18 (2) To certify attainment of biliteracy;
- 19 (3) To provide employers with a method to identify people with language and biliteracy
- 20 <u>skills</u>;
- 21 (4) To provide universities with a method to recognize and give academic credit to
- 22 <u>applicants seeking admission; and</u>
- 23 (5) To recognize and promote foreign language instruction in public schools.
- 24 (c) In order to qualify for the Georgia Seal of Biliteracy, a high school graduate shall meet
- 25 the following criteria:

26	(1) Completion of all English language arts requirements for graduation with an overall
27	grade point average of 3.0 or above in those classes; and
28	(2) Proficiency in one or more languages other than English, demonstrated through one
29	of the following methods:
30	(A) Passing a foreign language advanced placement examination with a score of 3 or
31	higher or an international baccalaureate examination with a score of 4 or higher;
32	provided, however, that for languages in which an advanced placement examination is
33	not available, the Department of Education may provide a listing of equivalent
34	summative examinations that local school systems may use in place of such an
35	advanced placement examination;
36	(B) Successfully completing a four-year high school course of study in a foreign
37	language and attaining an overall grade point average of 3.0 or above in such course of
38	study; or
39	(C) Passing the SAT II foreign language examination with a score of 600 or higher.
40	(d)(1) A local school system participating in the Georgia Seal of Biliteracy program shall
41	maintain appropriate records in order to identify pupils who have earned a Georgia Seal
42	of Biliteracy and shall affix the appropriate insignia to the diploma or transcript of each
43	pupil who earns such seal.
44	(2) Local school system participation in the Georgia Seal of Biliteracy program shall be
45	voluntary. No local school system shall be required to expend additional resources or
46	hire additional personnel to implement the provisions of this Code section.
47	(e) The Department of Education shall prepare and deliver to participating local school
48	systems an appropriate insignia to be affixed to the diploma or transcript of the pupil
49	indicating that such pupil has been awarded a Georgia Seal of Biliteracy."

50 SECTION 2.

51 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
