A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Title 49 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to social services, so
- 2 as to create the Georgia Gang Prevention and Intervention Task Force; to provide for duties
- 3 of the Department of Human Services and the commissioner of human services; to provide
- 4 for membership; to provide for powers and duties; to provide for related matters; to repeal
- 5 conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

7 SECTION 1.

- 8 Title 49 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to social services, is amended
- 9 by adding a new chapter to read as follows:

10 "<u>CHAPTER 11</u>

- 11 <u>49-11-1.</u>
- 12 (a) There is created the Georgia Gang Prevention and Intervention Task Force. Such task
- force shall be responsible for developing and maintaining a comprehensive state plan for
- 14 strategic, coordinated, and collaborative efforts between educational institutions and
- 15 <u>community and social services organizations for the implementation and maintenance of</u>
- programs and initiatives designed to prevent and intervene in criminal gang participation
- by youth.
- 18 (b) The Department of Human Services shall provide administrative support for the work
- of the task force and the commissioner of human services, or his or her designee who shall
- be an employee of the department, shall serve as secretary of the task force.

- 22 (a) The Georgia Gang Prevention and Intervention Task Force shall consist of 15 members
- 23 <u>as follows:</u>

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- 24 (1) The commissioner of human services or his or her designee;
- 25 (2) The State School Superintendent or his or her designee;
- 26 (3) The commissioner of juvenile justice or his or her designee;
- 27 (4) The president of the Georgia Sheriffs' Association or his or her designee who shall
- 28 be an elected sheriff;
- 29 (5) The chief executive officer of the State YMCA of Georgia or his or her designee who
- 30 <u>shall be employed as a staff member of the State YMCA of Georgia;</u>
- 31 (6) The chief executive officer of the Boys & Girls Clubs of Metro Atlanta or his or her
- designee who shall be employed as a staff member of the Boys & Girls Clubs of Metro
- 33 <u>Atlanta</u>;
- 34 (7) The executive director of the Association County Commissioners of Georgia or his
- 35 <u>or her designee;</u>
- 36 (8) The executive director of the Georgia Municipal Association or his or her designee;
- 37 (9) A district attorney appointed by the Prosecuting Attorneys' Council of Georgia;
- 38 (10) Six members who shall be educators or representatives of community or social
- 39 <u>service organizations with youth programs as follows:</u>
- 40 (A) Two members to be appointed by the Governor where one such member shall be
- designated by the Governor to serve as chairperson of the task force and one such
- 42 member shall be designated by the Governor to serve as vice chairperson of the task
- 43 <u>force</u>;
- 44 (B) Two members to be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor; and
- 45 (C) Two members to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 46 (b) Members provided for under paragraph (10) of subsection (a) of this Code section shall
- 47 <u>each be appointed for a term of two years and no member may serve more than two</u>
- 48 consecutive terms. All vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term by an appointee of
- 49 the original appointing official.
- 50 (c) The task force shall hold regular meetings at such times and such places as it may deem
- 51 <u>necessary or convenient to enable the task force to exercise fully and effectively its powers.</u>
- 52 perform its duties, and accomplish the objectives and purposes of this chapter. Special
- 53 meetings may be called by the chairperson or a majority of the members of the task force.
- 54 (d) A quorum for transacting business shall be determined by the members of the task
- 55 <u>force.</u>
- 56 (e) Members shall serve without compensation, although each member shall be reimbursed
- 57 <u>for actual expenses incurred in the performance of his or her duties from funds available</u>
- 58 to the department; provided, however, that any legislative member shall receive the
- 59 <u>allowances authorized by law for legislative members of interim legislative committees and</u>
- any members who are state employees shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred by them

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in the same manner as they are reimbursed for expenses in their capacities as state employees.

- 64 <u>The Georgia Gang Prevention and Intervention Task Force shall have the following powers</u>
- and duties:
- 66 (1) Develop and maintain a comprehensive state plan for strategic, coordinated, and
- 67 <u>collaborative efforts between educational institutions and community and social services</u>
- organizations for the purpose of preventing and intervening in criminal gang participation
- 69 <u>by youth;</u>
- 70 (2) To provide informational resources, strategic guidance, research, and best practices
- 71 <u>to social services and community organizations in the implementation of programs and</u>
- 72 <u>initiatives designed to prevent and intervene in criminal gang participation by youth; and</u>
- 73 (3) To establish and administrate a program of gang prevention and intervention grants
- that serve the purposes of this chapter, provided that funds are appropriated by the
- General Assembly for such purposes or the task force receives sufficient funds from
- 76 <u>private or federal grants or donations to fund such programs."</u>

77 SECTION 2.

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
