- (a) Beginning on the effective date of this Code section, the State of Georgia shall retain
  sole control over the development and revision of the content standards established
- 7 pursuant to Code Section 20-2-140; provided, however, that this shall not apply to courses
- 8 <u>developed and submitted by local boards of education for approval by the state board. On</u>
  - and after the effective date of this Code section, the state board shall comply with the clear
- legislative intent for the state to cease its participation in the national standards movement
- whether such standards originate as federally prescribed content standards or any national
- or multi-state content standards established by a consortium of states or a third party. The
- state shall not relinquish any binding control over its content standards as a condition of
- 14 <u>receiving any grant.</u>
- 15 (b) No official of the State of Georgia, whether elected or appointed or representing the
- state in any capacity, shall join, on behalf of the state or a state agency, any consortium,
- 17 <u>association, or entity or enter into a binding agreement, when such membership or</u>
- 18 <u>agreement would relinquish any measure of control over standards and assessments, to any</u>
- individual or entity outside the state.
- 20 (c) All state education agencies and entities shall annually submit to the General Assembly
- 21 <u>a detailed report of any educational grant, whether governmental or private, that such</u>
- 22 <u>agency or entity has applied for or received.</u> The report shall include:
- 23 (1) Long-term projections of unfunded costs for both state and local governments for at
- least four years beyond the end of the grant period;
- 25 (2) The purpose and effect of the program, including its effect on and interrelationship
- with any existing program currently operating within this state;
- 27 (3) Justification for the program and peer reviewed research, if any, that validates the
- 28 <u>effectiveness of the program; and</u>
- 29 (4) Any negative effects on the constitutional rights of Georgia citizens, including their
- 30 <u>right to exercise control over education."</u>
