# A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Article 1 of Chapter 1 of Title 37 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, 2 relating to general provisions related to governing and regulation of mental health, so as to 3 statutorily require the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities to 4 create, operate, and maintain the Georgia Crisis and Access Line; to provide for definitions; to provide certain requirements and functionality of the access line; to provide for behavioral 5 6 health care provider data; to require that the access line support calls with sufficient access 7 to behavioral health services and supports; to require any state-operated registry of available 8 inpatient psychiatric beds, crisis residential beds, or substance use disorder beds to report 9 data for purposes of the access line; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; 10 and for other purposes.

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## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

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### **SECTION 1.**

Article 1 of Chapter 1 of Title 37 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
general provisions related to governing and regulation of mental health, is amended by
adding a new Code section to read as follows:

16 ″<u>37-1-8.</u>

17 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:

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18	(1) 'Access line' means the Georgia Crisis and Access Line maintained and operated
19	pursuant to this Code section.
20	(2) 'Addictive disease' has the same meaning as in Code Section 37-1-1.
21	(3) 'Mental health or substance use disorder' means a mental illness or addictive disease.
22	(4) 'Mental illness' has the same meaning as in Code Section 37-1-1.
23	(b) Subject to appropriations, the department shall continue to maintain, operate, and make
24	available to the public a behavioral health telephone access line known as the Georgia
25	Crisis and Access Line. The department may contract for the design, operation, and
26	maintenance of the access line.
27	(c) The access line shall be available 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The access line
28	shall do all of the following:
29	(1) Have the ability to access information related to the availability of services, including
30	near real-time access to any registry of available inpatient psychiatric beds, crisis
31	residential beds, and substance use disorder beds; provided, however, that individuals
32	seeking behavioral health care shall be informed that any such registry data provided to
33	an individual may not be accurate and that bed availability is not guaranteed;
34	(2) Refer and connect individuals requiring mental health or substance use disorder
35	services to mental health professionals, including, but not limited to, community mental
36	health services programs and Medicaid providers, using telecommunications and digital
37	communications methods commonly in use, such as a telephone call, text message,
38	electronic mail, and internet chat;
39	(3) Implement practices to comply with all applicable laws respecting individual and
40	patient privacy;
41	(4) Implement practices to ensure the security of the data collected, in line with industry
42	best practices and in compliance with all applicable laws;

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43	(5) Notwithstanding paragraphs (3) and (4) of this subsection, collect data and utilize
44	data analytics to track the success of the access line's operations and identify trends in
45	service needs and outcomes; and
46	(6) Develop and utilize a customer relationship management infrastructure for the access
47	line to track, monitor, assign, follow up, and report on access line operations. The
48	department shall have operational oversight for, including access to and utilization of, the
49	customer relationship management infrastructure. Community mental health services
50	programs and Medicaid providers shall be authorized to access the customer relationship
51	management infrastructure.
52	(d) The Georgia Board of Health Care Workforce shall provide behavioral health care
53	provider data to the department. The department may use such data to leverage existing
54	databases and other sources of information identifying behavioral health care providers
55	providing mental health or substance use disorder treatment and rehabilitation services and
56	to utilize the most current provider information available.
57	(e) The access line shall be able to support calls with sufficient access to behavioral health
58	services and supports in accordance with this title.
59	(f) A state-operated registry of available inpatient psychiatric beds, crisis residential beds,
60	or substance use disorder beds shall report all data collected for such registry to the
61	department or the entity operating or maintaining the access line under contract with the
62	<u>department.</u> "

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## **SECTION 2.**

64 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
