- 1 Recognizing January 23, 2014, as Children's Day at the state capitol; and for other purposes.
- 2 WHEREAS, the future of Georgia depends on the ability of today's children to grow into
- 3 productive earners, loving parents, engaged citizens, and visionary leaders; and

- 5 challenges, or without family guidance, need resources and encouragement from the

- 11 qualify for free and reduced-price lunches, a 10 percent increase since 2007; and

- 13 Public Health, Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities, Early Care and Learning,
- 14 Education, Human Services, and Juvenile Justice, and the Governor's Office for Children and
- 15 Families, are setting higher goals for improving the lives of children and collaborating more
- 16 closely to achieve their goals; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Voices for Georgia's Children, a nonprofit organization, has convened
- 18 child-serving and child advocacy organizations for Children's Day at the state capitol to
- 19 encourage lawmakers to recognize the impact of public policy and programs on all aspects
