A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing January 23, 2023, as Korean American Day at the state capitol; and for other
- 2 purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, the 2023 Korean American Day marks the 120th anniversary of the first Korean
- 4 immigrants to the United States; and
- 5 WHEREAS, on January 13, 1903, the arrival of 102 courageous immigrants to the United
- 6 States initiated the beginning of Korean immigration to the United States; and
- 7 WHEREAS, these pioneer Korean immigrants overcame tremendous social and economic
- 8 obstacles to establish a new home in a new land through resilience, tenacious effort, and
- 9 immense sacrifice, which served as a foundation for their children and future generations of
- 10 Korean Americans; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Korean Americans, like immigrants to the United States before and after them,
- 12 have taken root and thrived because of strong family ties, robust community support, and
- 13 countless hours of hard work to provide for their families and communities; and

14 WHEREAS, members of the early Korean American community served with distinction in

- 15 the United States Armed Forces during World War I, World War II, and the conflict in
- 16 Korea; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Korean Americans have made significant contributions to the economic vitality
- 18 of the United States and the global marketplace; and
- 19 WHEREAS, the influence of Korean Americans may be observed in all facets of American
- 20 life, including their contributions to government, business, not-for-profit and other
- 21 nongovernmental organizations, technology, medicine, sports, the arts, and academia; and
- 22 WHEREAS, the population of Korean Americans in Georgia has increased 95 percent in the
- 23 last decade, and Korean Americans across this state serve as integral members of their
- 24 communities; and
- 25 WHEREAS, more than 100,000 Korean Americans call Georgia home, and Korean is the
- 26 third most spoken language in the State of Georgia; and
- 27 WHEREAS, more than 130 Korean companies have invested approximately \$14.5 billion
- 28 in foreign direct investments throughout the State of Georgia, which has strengthened the
- 29 economic partnership and diplomatic relationship between the Republic of Korea and the
- 30 State of Georgia; and
- 31 WHEREAS, prominent organizations and leaders have helped the Korean American
- 32 community in Georgia thrive, including the Korean American Foundation led by President
- 33 Michael Park, the Korean American Association of Greater Atlanta led by President Hongki
- Lee, the Federation of Korean Associations SEUS led by President Seung Won Hong, the

35 National Unification Advisory Council led by President Hyung Ryul Kim, the Korean

- 36 Consulate of Atlanta led by the Honorable Consul General Yoonjoo Park, the many Korean

- 39 cross-cultural-education, we recognize and honor Mr. Sunny Park, Mr. Baik Kyu Kim,
- 40 Mrs. Shreve Lee, Ms. Kook-Ja Lee, Mr. Jongwon Lee, and many others for their steadfast
- 41 support of the Korean American community in Georgia.
- 42 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
- 43 the members of this body recognize January 23, 2023, as Korean American Day at the state
- 44 capitol.
- 45 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
- and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
- 47 public and the press.
