- 1 Commending Alfred Watkins and recognizing March, 2018, as Music In Our Schools month
- 2 at the state capitol; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, March has been designated by the National Association for Music Education
- 4 (NAfME) as Music In Our Schools Month, encouraging schools across the nation to focus
- 5 on music education; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Music In Our Schools began with a one-day event in New York in 1973, and
- 7 has since grown into a month-long international celebration of school music; and
- 8 WHEREAS, the purpose of this celebration is to raise awareness of the importance of music
- 9 education, and to remind us that school is where all children should have access to music;

- 11 WHEREAS, Music In Our Schools Month is an opportunity for music teachers to bring their
- music programs to the attention of the school and the community, and to display the benefits
- 13 that school music provides students of all ages; and
- 14 WHEREAS, music education shapes the way students understand themselves and the world
- around them, allowing for a deep engagement with learning; and
- 16 WHEREAS, the skills nurtured by music education, such as creativity, collaboration,
- 17 communication, and critical thinking, are vital to students' academic, personal, and
- 18 professional success; and
- 19 WHEREAS, throughout the month of March, music educators and students across the State
- 20 of Georgia will demonstrate the importance of quality music programs to the lives of young
- 21 people, with concerts and other music related activities; and

WHEREAS, Alfred Watkins is the cofounder, musical director, and conductor of the Cobb

- Wind Symphony; the cofounder and president of the Minority Band Directors National
- 24 Association; the former Director of Bands at Murphy High School, where his bands
- 25 consistently earned superior ratings at both marching and concert events, and where he was
- 26 named 1978 Teacher of the Year; and the retired Director of Bands of Lassiter High School
- 27 in Cobb County, where he worked 37 years and where his concert ensembles and marching
- 28 bands gained a national reputation for excellence; and
- 29 WHEREAS, he developed the concept of Symphonic Band Camp; was the associate director
- 30 of the Atlanta Olympic Marching Band, which performed in the opening and closing
- 31 ceremonies of the 1996 Centennial Olympic Games in Atlanta; and has been the recipient of
- 32 countless awards and accolades, including 16 Certificates of Excellence from the National
- 33 Band Association, the Edwin Franco Goldman Award, and has been inducted into the Bands
- 34 of America Hall of Fame; and
- 35 WHEREAS, Alfred has served with numerous organizations, including the National Band
- 36 Association and Kappa Kappa Psi Honorary Band Fraternity, Inc.; and
- 37 WHEREAS, Georgia has been a significant supporter of music, strives to be the number one
- 38 state in music production, and joins its music students and educators in celebrating the power
- 39 of music education.

- 41 the members of this body commend Alfred Watkins and recognize March, 2018, as Music
