## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Commending the smart, talented second graders of Forrest Road Elementary School in
- 2 Columbus, Georgia, for their astronomy findings; and for other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, on April 21, 2015, the students of Ms. Bethany Getz's second grade class
- 4 remotely controlled a professional telescope and were able to photograph images of a solar
- 5 eruption from their classroom, and Ms. Getz used this lesson to teach her second graders
- 6 about stars and the patterns of the sun and moon; and
- 7 WHEREAS, the images, compiled together in a time-lapse video, were uploaded onto
- 8 spaceweather.com, and received over 20,000 views within a matter of weeks; and
- 9 WHEREAS, the students were guided by Mr. Michael Johnson, the external programs
- 10 coordinator at Columbus State University's Coca Cola Space Science Center, who showed
- 11 the children how to use the center's Real-time Interactive Solar Observatory, an educational
- 12 outreach program that allows teachers to use online telescope lessons in order to teach
- science standards, in order to capture the images of the eruption; and
- 14 WHEREAS, the students took 20 professional-grade pictures of the solar eruption within the
- span of one hour, and the images were converted into a 28 second video; and
- 16 WHEREAS, the solar eruption in question reached nearly 80,000 miles into space, which is
- 17 the length equivalent to stacking ten planet Earths on top of each other, and the solar eruption
- has been nicknamed "Getz's Dragon," in the second graders' honor; and
- 19 WHEREAS, in 2015, Muscogee County School District's partnership with Columbus State
- 20 University's Coca Cola Space Science Center allowed for the Center to visit all 32 of
- 21 Muscogee County School District's elementary schools, allowing hundreds of children to
- 22 participate in STEM activities; and
