A RESOLUTION

Recognizing the success of lay person CPR training in increasing the survival rate of cardiac
 arrest and supporting efforts to enhance public awareness of the need of such training; and
 for other purposes.

WHEREAS, two Gainesville students may not be here today if it were not for the lifesaving
measures of Dawn Wales and Gainesville City School staff who conducted immediate
bystander CPR and used in-school defibrillators to provide electrical shock to a stopped
heart; and

8 WHEREAS, heart disease affects men, women, and children of every age and race in the 9 United States, and sudden cardiac arrest (SCA) is a leading cause of death in the United 10 States, affecting approximately 356,000 people of all ages outside hospitals annually; and

WHEREAS, during this week alone, about 6,800 unsuspecting victims will suffer SCA, most of them at home (about 70 percent); their hearts will unexpectedly stop beating, blood will no longer flow to the brain and throughout the body, and they will collapse, stop breathing normally, and may appear to be having seizures—in essence, they will be dead and they will stay this way unless bystanders act immediately to restore their heartbeats with CPR and defibrillation; and 17 WHEREAS, unfortunately, only 46 percent of SCA victims receive the help that they need

18 from bystanders before EMS arrives at the scene; and

WHEREAS, for every minute that passes without CPR and defibrillation, the chances of survival decrease by 7-10 percent; as a result, only 10 percent of victims typically survive—survival rates could double or triple if more people knew what to do when SCA strikes; in fact, as many as 50,000 additional lives could be saved each year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that
 the members of this body pause in their deliberations to commend the great work by this

team of lifesavers from Gainesville City Schools in saving two students lives by initiatingCPR.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that today, February 23, 2023, is CPR-AED Awareness Day
at the Georgia state capitol.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized
and directed to make appropriate copies of this resolution available for distribution to the
public and the press.
