A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the Johnny Tolbert III House Study Committee on Heatstroke; and for other
- 2 purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, over 650 people in this country die per year from exposure to extreme heat.
- 4 These deaths are preventable. Heat is considered a silent killer. It doesn't come in a toppling
- 5 down of trees or lightning striking a field; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Georgia had the most heat-related football deaths in the country, with six
- 7 between 1980 and 2009; and
- 8 WHEREAS, in recent years, Georgia has had heat-related football deaths to both youth and
- 9 high school athletes; and
- 10 WHEREAS, in 2016, 12-year-old Johnny Tolbert III died from heatstroke during football
- 11 practice for a youth recreation team at Welcome All Park in South Fulton, Georgia; and
- 12 WHEREAS, in 2015, Burke County High School football player Roddrick "Rod" Williams
- 13 died shortly after football practice in Waynesboro, Georgia, from heat-related injuries; and
- 14 WHEREAS, the General Assembly must adopt measures to protect both youth and high
- 15 school athletes from serious or even catastrophic injuries or illnesses that can be the
- 16 consequences of a blinkered focus on competitiveness.
- 17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:
- 18 (1) **Creation of House study committee.** There is created the Johnny Tolbert III House
- 19 Study Committee on Heatstroke.
- 20 (2) **Members and officers.** The committee shall be composed of seven members of the
- House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of

Representatives. The Speaker shall designate a member of the committee as chairperson

- of the committee.
- 24 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
- issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- 27 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
- 28 may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
- convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
- accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.
- 31 (5) **Allowances and funding.** The legislative members of the committee shall receive
- 32 the allowances provided for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia
- Annotated. The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any
- member of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized.
- Funds necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds
- appropriated to the House of Representatives.
- 37 (6) **Report.**
- 38 (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that
- include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the
- same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to
- subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
- 42 (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for
- proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C)
- of this paragraph.
- 45 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of
- abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
- 47 A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with
- 48 the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
- (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Clerk of the
- House of Representatives a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu
- 51 thereof.
- 52 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2017.
