The House Committee on Juvenile Justice offers the following substitute to HR 768:

A RESOLUTION

- 1 Creating the House Study Committee on Mandatory Reporting of Child Abuse; and for other
- 2 purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Georgia's mandatory reporting law was created in 1965 and has not been
- 4 substantially rewritten since 1990; and
- 5 WHEREAS, the protection of children is of utmost importance to this body and society; and
- 6 WHEREAS, mandatory reporters include individuals working in health care, education, law
- 7 enforcement, and child welfare, and it is critical for mandatory reporters to identify what
- 8 needs to be reported and to whom and for there to be uniformity in the process of reporting
- 9 child abuse; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Georgia law requires certain individuals who have "reasonable cause to believe
- 11 that a child has been abused" must report such abuse, and there may be some confusion as
- 12 to when abuse should be reported; and
- 13 WHEREAS, schools and health care facilities may have different policies regarding reporting
- 14 child abuse, and there may be a need for consistent policies; and
- 15 WHEREAS, the Department of Human Services, prosecuting attorneys, and law enforcement
- all have an interest in ensuring that child abuse is properly reported.
- 17 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:
- 18 (1) **Creation of House study committee.** There is created the House Study Committee
- on Mandatory Reporting of Child Abuse.
- 20 (2) **Members and officers.** The committee shall be composed of five members of the
- House of Representatives to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
- Representatives. The Speaker shall also appoint an additional two nonlegislative

members of the committee. The Speaker shall designate one of the legislative appointees as chairperson of the committee.

- 25 (3) **Powers and duties.** The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
- 26 issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
- legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.
- 28 (4) **Meetings.** The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
- 29 may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
- 30 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
- accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.

32 (5) Allowances, expenses, and funding.

- 33 (A) The legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided
- for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.
- 35 (B) Members of the committee who are not legislators, state officials, or state
- 36 employees shall receive a daily expense allowance in an amount the same as that
- specified in subsection (b) of Code Section 45-7-21 of the Official Code of Georgia
- Annotated, as well as the mileage or transportation allowance authorized for state
- 39 employees.
- 40 (C) The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member
- of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized. Funds
- 42 necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds
- appropriated to the House of Representatives.

44 (6) **Report.**

- 45 (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that
- include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the
- same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to
- subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
- 49 (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for
- proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C)
- of this paragraph.
- 52 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of
- abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
- A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with
- 55 the Clerk of the House of Representatives.
- 56 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Clerk of the
- House of Representatives a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu
- 58 thereof.
- 59 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2016.
