## A RESOLUTION

Commending the Atlanta Jewish Film Festival and recognizing its 24th year; and for other
 purposes.

WHEREAS, the Atlanta Jewish Film Festival (AJFF) is the largest film festival in Atlanta
and the State of Georgia and is one of the largest Jewish film festivals in the world; and

5 WHEREAS, the AJFF inspires communities to new levels of social and cultural 6 understanding by entertaining and engaging diverse audiences with film observed through 7 a Jewish lens; and

8 WHEREAS, AJFF cooperates with leaders from various religious, ethnic, cultural, and 9 educational groups, including public and private schools, colleges and universities, to create 10 programming that deepens dialogue and bonds between communities; and

WHEREAS, AJFF works in partnership with its founder, the Atlanta Regional Office of American Jewish Committee (AJC), a global advocacy organization that enhances the well-being of the Jewish people and Israel through education, outreach, and diplomacy; and 14 WHEREAS, the annual festival was founded in 2000 by the AJC, and its inaugural group of

15 filmgoers amounted to more than 1,900; by 2006, that figure had increased to about 7,500,

16 and by 2008, they began adjusting their itinerary to include more dates and bigger venues to

hold nearly 15,000 filmgoers; and 17

18 WHEREAS, for their tenth anniversary, AJFF had a concert of iconic Jewish film scores,

19 presented in partnership with the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra and Turner Classic Movies,

20 resulting in nearly 20,000 moviegoers; and

21 WHEREAS, in 2015, the AJFF made history by becoming the largest Jewish film festival

22 in the world, attracting more than 38,600 moviegoers; and

23 WHEREAS, during the COVID pandemic, the AJFF continued programming and added 24 streaming and drive-in components to its festival.

## 25 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES that 26 the members of this body commend the Atlanta Jewish Film Festival for its many 27 contributions to the arts in our community and for fostering stronger ties by educating 28 communities that have religious, ethnic, and cultural differences; recognize the grand 29 occasion of its 24th festival happening February 13-26 in multiple theaters across the greater 30 Atlanta area; and note that the Atlanta Jewish Film Festival will host a streaming component 31 with tickets available for purchase throughout Georgia from February 27 through March 7, 32 2024.

33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of the House of Representatives is authorized 34 and directed to make an appropriate copy of this resolution available for distribution to the 35 Atlanta Jewish Film Festival.
