The House Committee on Rules offers the following substitute to SB 198:

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1 To amend Code Section 33-64-9.1 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to 2 reimbursement methodologies utilized by pharmacy benefits managers, so as to provide for 3 reimbursement requirements relating to the state health benefit plan or plans established for 4 school teachers, school employees, and state employees; to provide for related matters; to 5 repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.
