A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 12 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 commissions and other agencies, so as to create the Georgia International Affairs
- 3 Commission; to provide for membership and terms of office; to provide for assignment of
- 4 the commission to the Department of Economic Development for administrative purposes;
- 5 to provide for powers and duties; to require an annual report; to provide for related matters;
- 6 to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

8 SECTION 1.

- 9 Chapter 12 of Title 50 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to commissions
- and other agencies, is amended by repealing and reenacting Article 1 to read as follows:
- 11 "ARTICLE 1
- 12 50-12-1.
- 13 (a) There is created the Georgia International Affairs Commission. The commission shall
- be composed of 21 members as follows:
- 15 (1) The Governor, ex officio, who shall be the chairperson of the commission;
- 16 (2) Eight members shall be appointed by the Governor;
- 17 (3) Six members shall be appointed by the President of the Senate; and
- 18 (4) Six members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
- 19 (b) The members of the commission shall be any persons of recognized ability and
- 20 <u>achievement</u>. All vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term by the original appointing
- 21 <u>official</u>. Each appointed member shall serve for terms equivalent to the term of office of
- 22 <u>the appointing official who made his or her appointment and until his or her successor has</u>
- been appointed. Members shall be eligible for successive appointments by an appointing
- 24 <u>official</u>. Each person appointed to the commission shall be a full-time resident of Georgia.

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25 Any member who ceases to be a full-time resident of Georgia during the term of his or her

- 26 membership shall be removed from the commission, and such vacancy shall be filled by
- 27 <u>the appointing official who made the original appointment.</u>
- 28 (c) The commission shall be assigned to the Department of Economic Development for
- 29 <u>administrative purposes only, as prescribed in Code Section 50-4-3.</u>
- 30 <u>50-12-2.</u>
- 31 (a) The commission shall elect a vice chairperson and a secretary from among its members
- 32 <u>for terms of two years, and any member shall be eligible for successive election to such</u>
- office by the commission.
- 34 (b) A quorum for transacting business shall be a majority of the members of the
- 35 <u>commission.</u>
- 36 <u>50-12-3.</u>
- 37 (a) The commission shall have the following powers and duties:
- 38 (1) To be a resource and an ambassador to foreign states regarding economic and social
- 39 <u>matters concerning this state, including, but not limited to, energy, natural resources,</u>
- 40 <u>agriculture, tourism, entertainment, and sports;</u>
- 41 (2) To investigate, study, and undertake ways and means of establishing and maintaining
- 42 <u>this state as an international state;</u>
- 43 (3) To facilitate relations with foreign states that serve to benefit this state and to
- 44 <u>investigate, study, and undertake ways and means of establishing and maintaining such</u>
- 45 <u>positive relations;</u>
- 46 (4) To promote, encourage, and provide advisory assistance to state, local, and
- 47 community professional, business, and civic organizations regarding international affairs;
- 48 (5) To collect and disseminate information regarding international relations;
- 49 (6) To consult with and advise the Governor and any state department, agency, board,
- 50 <u>commission</u>, or authority on matters pertaining to international relations;
- 51 (7) To cooperate with the government of the United States and the governments of other
- 52 <u>states in programs relating to international relations;</u>
- (8) To accept public or private grants, devises, and bequests; and
- 54 (9) To hold public hearings, conduct studies, or take any other action the commission
- deems necessary to fulfill its responsibilities.
- 56 (b) The commission shall organize itself into subcommittees specializing on the regions
- of Africa, the Americas, Asia, and Europe.
- 58 (c) The commission shall be authorized to enter into all contracts and agreements
- 59 <u>necessary or incidental to perform its duties.</u>

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60 (d) All executive departments, agencies, boards, commissions, and authorities shall

- 61 <u>cooperate with the commission in the performance of its duties.</u>
- 62 <u>50-12-4.</u>
- The members of the commission shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred while
- 64 <u>conducting the business of the commission from public or private grants, devises, or</u>
- 65 <u>bequests received by the commission.</u>
- 66 <u>50-12-5.</u>
- 67 The commission shall publish in print or electronically an annual report summarizing the
- 68 <u>activities, findings, and recommendations of the commission. The report shall be</u>
- 69 <u>submitted to the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of</u>
- Representatives, and all members of the Senate and the House of Representatives not later
- 71 <u>than November 1 of each year beginning in 2020."</u>
- 72 SECTION 2.
- All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
